the Emergency Relief funds for use on the national forests in the state according to a telegram received at Portland this week by C. J. Buck, regional forester. A sum Ladies 10c Business Stationery-Office Forms of \$529,521 has been set out for use in Washington.

Work projects, according to M: Buck, will include construction and maintenance of firebreaks, forest fire lookout stations, telephone lines, forest roads and trails, tree planting and nursery work, timber stand improvement, forest fire prevention and control, fire hazard reduction, development of recreational facilities, insect and disease control, forest range improvements, timber, forage, water and wild life surveys, and other forest improvement work.

Take Men From Relief Rolls Men for the work will be selected from employables on the state relief rolls, according to instructions received. Under an executive order signed by the president, schedules of monthly earnings in the various types of areas throughout the United States have been established as basis for wages on the works program. For purposes of this schedule, the United States has been divided into four regions. Oregon and Washington are in Region 1, having the highest wage schedule in the country. Classifications are setup for common. semi-skilled, skilled and profesional workers. A further breakdown in wage rates is made withthe population of the largest municipality within the county.

# Wage Scale Is Set

Under this set-up, common labor wages vary from \$40 per month to \$55 per month. The rates paid on East End 6th Ave. Eugene, Ore. this program in the 3,000 odd counties in the United States were typically determined by a local wage committee consisting of one representative of pusiness, one representative of labor, and the local relief administrator. # SURVEY SHOWS LOSS DUE TO LUMBER STRIKE LUMBER OUTPUT

PORTLAND, Ore., July 3-A graphic picture of employment loss due to strike conditions in the Oregon and Washington west coast lumber industry is contained in a Production Rises From 22 To district survey in the current issue of the Four-L Lumber News, published here.

"This survey," says the Lumber News, "is not a mere guess or estimate. It is the result of an exhaustive plant-by-plant, district-bydistrict contact with the operations covered.

"In the west coast districts of Washington, a total of 243 logging operations and 418 lumber manufacturing plants (sawmills, planing mills, shingle mills, plywood, door and box factories) employed 34,495 men before the strike. Of this number, 27,505 were idle because of strike conditions on June 28.

"In Oregon west coast districts a total of 224 logging operations and 339 lumber manufacturing plants employed 16.955 men before the strike. Of this number 4440 were idle because of strike conditions on June 28.

"Our survey covered a total of 1224 operations, employing 51,450 persons just prior to the strike, of

which 31,945 were idle on June 28. "Those unfamiliar with the lumber industry may question the statement that 553 Oregon operations employ only half as many men as do the 661 Washington operations. The explanation lies in the fact that Oregon has twice as many small camps and mills as Washington, employing fewer men per operation."

35 Million Feet; Half Of Weekly Average

Seattle Wash., July 3-Lumber production has increased four consecutive weeks from a low of 22. 900,000 feet the week ending May 25 to 35,500,000 feet the week of June 22, an increase of 55 per cent according to the West Coast Lumbernien's Association. Production now is approximately 50 per cent of the average weekly since January 1. More mills are operating each week and several since the strike started, including the Booth-Kelly company sawmill at Springfield, have opened double shifts. Operating mills, most of which are in Oregon, generally report fulltime schedules.

A total of 519 down and operating mills in Oregon and Washington which reported to the association, produced 35,563,677 board feet of lumber. This was approximately 1,500,000 feet over the preceding week. The average weekly production of this group of sawmills in 1935 has been 71,086,326 feet; during the same period in 1934 their weekly average was 79,548,989 feet.

The new business reported last week by 519 mills was 48,806,533 board feet against a production of 35,563,677 feet and shipments of 38,102,424 feet. Their shipments were over production by 7.1 per cent and their current sales were over production by 37.2 per cent. The orders booked last week by this group of identical mills were under the total in the preceding week by about 3,000,000 feet or approximately 5.4 per cent.

A group of 426 identical mills whose records are complete for both periods show total orders 1935 to date of 2.018,599,000 board feet, ompared with 1,821,780,000 board feet for the same period in 1934, an increase of 10.8 per cent. The unfilled order file at these

mills stood at 396,197,802 board feet, approximately 9,400,000 feet over the week before. Th aggregate inventories of 426 mills are 21.5 per cent less than at this time last


