MINORS CAN NOT SMOKE

The Law Forbids it

By request of some of our Citizens we obtained the following information from the Prosecuting Attorney, J. K. Starr, and publish same for the benefit of all who desire to know what restrictions govern the use of tobacco by the youths of Oregon.

Replying to your favor of the 20th inst., the following sections of Lord's Oregon Laws, control the sale of Tobacco to minors:

Sec. 2148.—Unlawful to Furnish Minors Tobacco Without Guardians Consent.

It shall be unlawful to sell, barter, trade, give or in any manner furnish to any minor under the age of eighteen years, any tobacco, cigars, or cigarettes in any form, or any compound in which tobacco forms a component part, without the written consent or order of such minor's parents or guardian; and when such minor has no parents or guardian, then in that case consent may be given by the county court, sitting for the transaction of county business, upon the proper application in the county in which said minor may have his residence. Any person violating the provisions of this act shall, upon conviction, be fined in any sum not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$50.00 L. 1893, P. 86, Sections 1, 2; B. & C. Sec. 1981.

Sec. 2149.—unlawful for a minor to smoke in public.

It shall be unlawful for any minor under the age of eighteen years to smoke or in any way use any cigar, cigarette, or tobacco in any form whatsoever in any public highway, street, place, square or resort. Any minor violating the provisions of this act shall, upon conviction, be fined in any sum not less than \$1.00 nor more than \$10.00, or by imprisonment at the option of the court, two days for each offense. Justice of the Peace shall have concurrent jurisdiction with the Circuit Court for all offenses under this act. L. 1893, p. 86, Sec. 3, 4, 5; B. & C. Sec. 1981.
