Linn County Proceed.

From the Salem Journal; The Linn county exhibit occupies the most conspicuous place in the grand pavilion just at the main entrance, and always has crowds of interested spectators asking questions and expressing surprise at the wonderful variety and extent of the displays.

It occupies 3x35 feet floor room and wall space 14 feet high. In a perfect stockade of grain heaves and grasses artistically arranged rises a pyramid of green fruits and a pedestal of fruit in glass jars.

In front and on the shelves are the vegetables. The entire right hand corner is filled with a medicinal display. The work of putting up the Linn exhibit was entirely in charge of C. W. Watts, with a force of men, and the result is a perfect success.

Watts is a beaver to work. He is on deck from 8 o'clock A. M. to 10 P. M. and no one leaves without knowing that grain and fruit are king and queen and their joint throne is in Linn county.

It is a school of information and one of the most commendable features of this state fair. Also it is correct in nomenclature, every variety having a label giving its name. There are 68 varieties of apples, including—single specimens of Gloriana mudi weighing 24 oz; Alexander 18 oz; 9 varieties of pears; 6 of peaches, single specimens of the Susquehanna variety measuring 12 1/2 inches in circumference and weighing 15 oz. Quinces, grapes, chestnuts, walnuts, hickory nuts, filberts in variety. They have 125 jars of fruits, consisting of peaches, apricots, plums, pears, prunes, cherries, gooseberries, strawberries, currants, raspberries and figs.

Also a very creditable exhibit of dried fruit. There are 78 varieties of crosses, including Johnson, atlas, and orchard, measuring over 10 ft. in height. There are Sard vetches, the coming great cow food plant, 6 ft high, grown quite commonly in Linn county. There are 30 varieties of wheat, 8 of oats, 6 of barley, including the Silver Mine variety.

In wheat they show Defiance, one stool of which contains 64 heads, 812 meshes, 3649 kernels produced from a single grain. Senator Dawson and three reliable men did the counting. Of the Surprise variety one stool has 37 heads, 442 meshes, 342 berries from one grain. It is they have a good exhibit, consisting of varieties raised from seed imported from Ireland. There is a large display of vegetables including sugar beets weight 35 pounds each; 12 varieties corn, table beets of 30 lbs; 9 varieties of onions, 40 specimens of which weigh 130 lbs., two of which weigh 56 oz each; string beans 2 feet 1 inches in length; rhubarb 6 1/2 inches in circumference, 34 inches long; leaf 32 feet in circumference; strawberries 9 inches across, 7 filling a quart measure; 403 gooseberries on a 6 inch stem.

Their exhibit of native medicinal plants is simply complete and grand, undoubtedly the most successful ever collected and placed on exhibition in the Northwest. It consists of 49 distinct kinds all growing wild within the borders of Linn county, among which are calamus, sarsaparilla, cascara, ginseng, etc.

The exhibit including samples of oils distilled from the plants. There are also five samples of salts from the various medicinal and soda springs of the county. There are specimens of ore from the Santiam mines, some of which assay up nearly \$1000 per ton.

Judge Barton has been at the fair, working hard to see that each apple has its best shine on, and its highest side out. He informs us that Linn county appropriated \$300 to defray the expenses of collecting and exhibiting the collection, \$250 of which will be expended by the time the collection is returned to Albany.

Linn county was awarded first prize of \$150 in cash and a great advertisement.
