OREGON ROADS TRIUMPH.

Concessions on Both Sides, But the O. R. & N. and O. S. L. Are Victorious.

Salt Lake, Oct. 26.—President Mohler, accompanied by Traffic Manager Campbell and General Superintendent O'Brien, left for Portland this evening after a highly successful conference with the Union Pacific and Short Line officials.

The fast-freight line of the Union Pacific to Portland by way of Sacramento will be taken off, and the tariff relations existing with the Oregon road before the cancellation of September 23 will be fully restored.

In the matter of the division of freight charges, it is understood that the Union Pacific secured concessions, the details of which are for the present withheld.

ONE HUNDRED DEATHS. New Orleans, Oct. 26.—Before 7 o'clock this evening the 100 mark of deaths during the present period of yellow fever prevalence had been reached.

To Protect Americans. Washington, Oct. 26.—The state department has received a cablegram from the charge d'affaires at Guatemala City, stating that owing to the extension of the present revolutionary movement into the eastern portion of Guatemala, American interests in that section and American citizens are endangered.

The past week has been a very quiet one in the grain trade, with narrow fluctuations. Europe took 6,800,000 bushels of our wheat, and from other countries about 3,000,000 bushels.

Receipts of spring at Minneapolis by the flouring mills have been very large, running as high as 1,100 cars in one day.

Regarding the fall wheat. Much relief in the drought regions has been experienced by quite extended rains, which in many places were fairly liberal, and in others less important.

Butter—Fancy creamery, 45@50c; fair to good, 35@40c; dairy, 25@35c per roll.

Butter—Fancy native creamery, brick, 25@26c; ranch, 10@15c. Cheese—Natchez, 10@12c; California, 9@10c per pound.
