Europe's eyes to the truth that we are not to be the toys of diplomatic games concocted in Berlin, Vienna and her other capitals.

We went to war with reluctance when the Maine was blown up by treachery, and we are not ready for peace except upon our own terms, and when we are in full possession of Porto Rico and the Philippines. France ought to have made peace the morning after the surrender of Sedaa, but she did not feel that she was beaten until Paris had fallen. Russia had to rush up to the gates of Constantinople to humble the Turk, and it looks very much as if Spain will not know she is beaten until we take the Canaries and move our squadron against Cadiz, Barcelona and Ferrol.

Despatches received in Madrid from Havana state that there is "an enthusiastic desire in the city to continue the war." A few hours' bombardment of our fleet, reinforced by the volcanic earthquakes projected from the Vesuvius, would greatly moderate this desire. It is one of the mysteries of this war why Havana, the seat and symbol of Spain's power in Cuba, has been let so severely alone.

The war between the United States and Spain is now fast nearing an end, and should there not be another gun fired the victories won by the American forces—both on land and sea—will go down in history as the greatest ever achieved by any nation on earth. The stars and stripes still wave untarnished, and will continue to wave until time shall be no more.

According to statistics the colored people of the United States are paying taxes on \$264,000,000 worth of property. This is not a bad showing for a people who thirty-two years ago were merely chattels themselves.

Clarence Stockton, of Oakville, who was injured seven days ago by being thrown from a horse upon a fence, died Friday morning from concussion of the brain. He was 35 years old. He leaves a widow and two children.

Governor-elect Geer, when he takes his office, will continue to reside in the country, riding into town on a wheel or in a carriage. He does not expect to entertain, during his term, a governor is elected for something else besides that.

Henry Peck, of Pendleton has three combined harvesters at work on his wheatfields. Two of them are drawn by 24 horses each, and harvest about 35 acres a day; one is drawn by an engine, and covers between 50 and 60 acres daily.

The stern wheel steamer Valley Queen, just newly built at Independence by Capt. Kimer, was launched last Saturday. She is 85 feet long, 17 feet beam, and draws but 7 inches of water before her machinery is installed. Machinery will have 100 horse power.

An unsophisticated individual on the train from Astoria to Portland Sunday last was curious enough to try the effect of pulling aside a lever between the cars. As a result the train was uncoupled, an air hose and bell cord were broken, and an hour's work entailed for repairs.

In a fire in Ashland Friday the Shannon hotel, recently purchased by J. N. Coubs, formerly of Albany, was burned, also a grocery store, restaurant, barber shop and an adjoining small building. The loss was about \$10,000, with \$4000 insurance. Mr. Coubs' loss was about \$2000, insured for \$1200.

The amount subscribed for the war bonds—\$1,325,000,000—was \$325,000,000 more than the indemnity which Germany demanded of France of the close of the war of 1870-71. France surprised the world by taxing the indemnity which

she had to pay to Germany.
