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ANOTHER COAST ROAD

It is Said the Burlington Will Extend Its Line Westward This Summer.

According to the Phillipsburg, Mont., Mail, the Burlington road will be among the first to commence extending its line to a Pacific coast port. The Burlington will extend its line further westward this summer, and report has it that operations will be commenced in the spring by the Burlington Company to extend its line from Billings to Butte and Anaconda by way of Livingston, and from Anaconda the proposed route will touch Phillipsburg and the Bitter Root Valley, and will terminate at Portland.

New Granite Discovery.
A large quantity of granite excellent for monumental purposes was located recently in the Niles & Vinson marble mine near Joseph, Or. Some three acres are exposed to view, containing fine salt and pepper gray color granite, clear from rust and blemishes, and susceptible of a high polish. Considering high freights and that nearly all the monumental granite is shipped to this coast from Boston and New York, the importance of this discovery means much for Oregon, Washington and Idaho.

Oregon Redwood Forest.
A. J. Johnson, the forestry man of Oregon, has recently returned from a month's trip along the Oregon coast, inspecting the forestry conditions of that locality. In addition to other discoveries, he says he found a number of fine redwood forests in Oregon, at least 10 miles this side of the California line. For a long time it has been claimed that no redwood could be found in Oregon. Mr. Johnson's discovery puts an end to all doubt along this line.

Dangerous Substitute for a Knife.
Recently a daughter of Thomas Payne, residing across the Willamette from Albany, Or., went up in her garage of the house with a lamp after a rope that she wanted. No having a knife, she burned the rope off with the lamp and took it down stairs, but the end of the rope left did not stop burning, and spread into the roof. A neighbor discovered the fire, and it was extinguished after some work, but not until it had burned quite a hole in the roof.

Price of Hay.
Washington hay now brings from \$3 to \$6 per ton, the low price being due to the large amount of hay on hand. Last year many commission men speculated, believing there would be an increase in the price for hay in Alaska during the construction of the Stikine river railroad, purchased all of this product they could find. The road was not built, and consequently no demand for the hay occurred.

Fruit Trees Killed.
W. H. H. Miller, who has 30 acres of 8-year-old prime trees three miles north of Eugene, Or., has had them killed by experts, who report them all killed by the recent cold weather.

To Build Evaporating Plant.
N. A. Waldahl, of Albany, is making inquiries of the number of acres of Italian prunes, the age of the trees, and the number of drivers in the vicinity of Sheridan, Or., with a view to erecting a large evaporating plant in the vicinity of Sheridan this summer.

For a Hogrowers' Union.
A movement is on foot to organize a hogrowers' union in Polk county. The object of the union will be the protection of the growers and the establishing of agencies in the central markets of the United States.

Will Maintain Its Hospital.
Acting on advice received from Manila by cable, the California Red Cross Society has decided to continue the maintenance of its hospital station in that city as long as the California volunteers remain in the Orient.

Point Wilson Fortifications.
About 150 men are at work on the government fortifications at Point Wilson, at the southern city limits of Port Townsend. The force is to be increased as the work proceeds.

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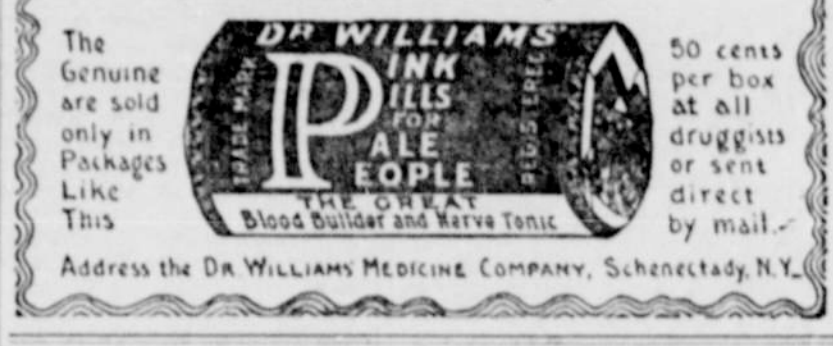
