Beef-Gross, top steers, 4.00 @ \$4.50; If they are true, they would prove that the quickest way to get rich was to write a successful play. It takes about two years, however, for a skilled dramatist, like Bronson Howard, to make a play, and he cannot guarantee that Onions, 80c@\$1.10 per 100 pounds it will be liked by the unfathomable public. I do not know what Mr. Howard receives, but the typical pay of a dramatic author is 5 per cent, of the gross receipts weekly. But there is no fixed standard of payment. Some playwrights get a certain sum down and the usual royalty of 5 per cent. Others Cabbage, native and California are paid on a sliding scale. One noted pair of collaborators received for one of their productions 6 per cent. of the gross receipts up to \$6,000 and 1 per over that figure. As their work drew \$10,000 a week for the first six weeks, their manager had to pay them \$700 a week for the use of their work. In the case of purely theatrical hack-work smaller prices are paid, and the rate is often fixed at so much a night, \$25 being a good fee. For adaptations royalties are seldom paid in this country. 
