### BY THE EDITOR

In this issue will be found a statement  
of the amount of real estate sold in this vicinity within the past  
six months and which shows that \$56,100 has been paid out here for a  
total of 36.7 acres of land. Scio has  
not done much in the way of advertising  
her resources and advantages as compared to other towns in the  
valley; had it done so this total might  
have been much larger. There are  
now located here twenty-five Bohemian families, making about 125  
persons, and they are all good citizens,  
able and willing workers, and have brought with them ample  
means to pay as they go. They have organized a lodge of their own  
fraternal beneficiary society and have  
erected a hall in which to hold their  
meetings and also to hold public  
meetings of all kinds. They have an excellent brass band under  
the leadership of Prof. Joseph Cibulka,  
who was prominent in musical  
circles at the Omaha Exposition last year, and they possess talent  
sufficient to give a very creditable  
exhibition. Mr. V. Cladek being an  
expert slight of hand performer. Many cities and towns throughout  
Oregon have from time to time presented figures to show that they  
were locating lots of people within  
their midst, but we doubt if any of them  
can show figures equal to those we present today, taking into  
consideration the amount of labor and advertising done by each place  
as compared to that of Scio. The sales mentioned herein were all

An interesting historical fact dating  
to 1873, has come to light, in which Admiral Dewey was the central  
figure. Dewey, then a commander,  
was in command of the United  
States ship Narragansett, on the  
Astatiticating, having taken charge of the vessel March 1, 1872. The  
vessel was on surveying duty when  
the Virginia duty was precipitated and a war with Spain seemed imminent. Commander Dewey wrote  
to the navy department requesting  
that in case war was declared he  
should be assigned to the duty of  
capturing Manila. The peaceful settlement  
of the controversy with Spain avoided the necessity of hostile  
demonstration, but the interesting  
fact is that the doughty officer  
had his eye on Manila over a quarter  
of a century ago. A search will  
be made for the letter in the files of  
the navy department and if found it  
is expected an effort will be made  
by the citizens committee to have  
it reproduced as a souvenir of the  
reception to be tendered Admiral  
Dewey upon his arrival in New  
York.
