The medals will be very highly appreciated by the men who receive them and will be treasured as heirlooms by their descendants.

Interviews with prominent hotel proprietors, indicate that there will soon be a rise in the rates charged and that rates would be raised all over the coast as has been done in most places in the east. The cause of this advance in rates is owing to the advance in price of almost every item of expenditure in running hotels, including not only culinary supplies of nearly all kinds but also of labor required to every department, which makes it impossible to run the business at the old rates without positive loss and ultimate failure.

There must be a very shelter as the goat is a very tender animal. The care of the feet is another important point. Goats have tender feet, and in nearly every herd there are lame ones caused by an abnormal growth of the hoof which seems to be characteristic with Angoras. In nearly every case they can be cured with a little attention. Goats are always a good price. Mohair brings a good figure, and in killing out brush the goat is valuable. They eat very little grass, and other stock can be pastured with them, which is not the case with sheep. While there is some prejudice against goat meat the flesh is very fine for food. It tastes very much like venison. At present there is not enough mohair produced in this country to supply the home demand, and a large amount is imported from Turkey. Raise more goats it will pay.

A very good thing to look after is the charge in road district. The Florence West says: The laws adopted by the last legislature will compel the county court to make many changes in the boundaries of road districts. By the notice published in another column it will be seen that our county court are already considering the matter and are anxious to find out what changes are desired. The law now requires that each district shall all be in one election precinct, but each precinct may be divided into any number of road districts.

Tabulara Bay Improvement. In his annual report to the secretary of war concerning river and harbor improvements chief engineer General John M. Wilson, says of Yaquina harbor: "The expenditures up to June 30, 1898, \$687,379.28, resulted in completing both jetties in accordance with the original project of 1880 and as amended in 1882 1888 and 1893, with the exception of placing about 10,000 tons of stone on the north jetty. This work resulted in fixing the channel in width and location as projected and in obtaining from 14 to 15 feet of water on the bar at mean low tide, or from 21 to 22 feet at high tide, whereas the project provided for only 17 feet at high tide, thus obtaining several more feet than was projected. This original amended project may be said, therefore, to be satisfactorily completed.

More Game Birds. Mr. Schaffenberg, of Mount Tabor who is now in Copenhagen writes to Captain W. J. Riley that he has secured 150 pairs of partridges which will be shipped to Oregon. A sum of money was raised among local sportsmen for this purpose and entrusted to Mr. Schaffenberg for expenditure as he was going to Europe. He also ordered 10 pairs of black cock in Sweden, which will be turned loose in the valley. The partridges are strictly field birds, and stick to open country and cultivated lands. The black cock is more of a brush bird. -Telegram.
