## BY THE EDITOR

People often jump blindly at conclusions and sometimes injure themselves by doing so. An example of this was exhibited before the county court at Albany last week in the opposition to the extension of North Scio voting precinct. The opposition got the idea into their heads that they were being "jobbed," but instead of asking any questions proceeded to "remonstrance" which they did with success. Now since the matter has been made clear to them the wish they "hadn't spoke," and well they might, for the advantages of being taken into North Scio precinct are many, and the defeat of the petition simply shows what men will do when acting too hastily, if men would "think before they speak" it would save them time and money in many instances.

Voters should remember that the new registry law requires that all who wish to avail themselves of the privilege of the franchise at the coming state election in June, must register their names with the county clerk, justice of the peace, or a notary public who is provided with necessary blanks, on or before May 15th, 1900, as those who fail to comply with the mandates of the law will not be allowed to vote. Persons who have acquired citizenship by naturalization papers when presenting themselves for registration—this is imperative. Don't neglect this important matter until too late, but register at once.

A new paper has sprung into existence in Marion county, and we acknowledge the receipt of a copy of the initial number. It bears the title of Aurora. It is an eight page five column paper, and the name of H. A. Snyder appears at the head as manager. The gentleman is a stranger to THE NEWS but his paper shows him to be a hustler of the genuine sort, and we do not hesitate to predict for him a hearty and continued support.

The Salem Sentinel has changed hands, and likewise political faith. It is now published by Messrs Dalrymple & Miller, and proposes to advocate the principles of democracy pure and simple. Heretofore it has been classed as an anti-Republican paper, "what ever you mane by that."

The name W. M. Brown, a well known Lebanon attorney, and editor of the Critter, of that city, has been mentioned for the nomination for county judge on the republican ticket at the approaching election.

"I would to God that the truth of this whole Philippine situation could be known by every one in America as I know it. If the real history, inspiration and conditions of this insurrection, and the influences, local and external, that now encourage the enemy, as well as the actual possibilities of these islands and peoples and their relations to this great East could be understood at home, we would hear no more talk of unjust "shooting of government" into the Philippines or hauling down our flag in the Philippines. If the so-called anti-imperialist would honestly ascertain the truth on the ground, and not in distant America they, whom I believe to be honest men misinformed would be convinced of their error of their statements and "conclusions and of the unfortunate effect of their publications here."—General Lawton.
