In application of J. W. Gaines et al for county road, J. W. Burkhardt, G. M. Westfall and Joe Stewart were appointed viewers to meet on March 20 at 8 a. m.

GREEN MORRIS FOUND GUILTY
The case of the State vs P. G. Morris was finished Wednesday afternoon, going to the jury about 3 o'clock. The plaintiff showed that the defendant had accounted for \$1,264.54 during the second term. The defense took the position that Morris had received no benefit from the amount and had no intention of defrauding the county. The arguments on both sides were strong presentations of the case and the attorneys covered every point. The jury returned a verdict of guilty about 8 o'clock. The penalty is from 1 to 15 years in the penitentiary. He will be sentenced next Wednesday.

The trial of P. G. Morris, the defaulting county treasurer of Linn county, on a charge of larceny of public money, was begun before Judge Burnett Tuesday with the following jury: A. J. McClure, John Cochell, Geo. Alford, E. L. Plummer, James Morgan, J. D. Griffin, W. A. Farley, G. B. Spawan, S. Leaper, C. O. Rice, Josiah Washie, H. Karstens. District Attorney Samuel Hayden and H. C. Watson represented the state and H. H. Hewitt and J. K. Weatherford the defense.
By consent, Percy Farrell, accused of larceny from a dwelling, was allowed to plead guilty to petty larceny, and after some wholesome advice from Judge Burnett, was sentenced to two months imprisonment in the state penitentiary.
The district attorney presented a true bill against J. P. Hahn, of Sweet Home, on a charge of assaulting A. L. Weddle. The defendant pled not guilty, and the case was continued.
