### Linn County Expansion.

Linn county has caught the fever of expansion, and we are told that an effort will be made at the legislature to annex a part of Lane county to Linn county. The movement was started some time ago and has gained advocates wherever it has become known and understood. The proposition is to take back into Linn county about two townships located in the extreme northeastern part of Lane county, which townships were given to Lane county through legislative enactment a number of years ago. It is claimed upon reliable authority that these townships were given to Lane through a mistake, it being the intention only to let Lane have those townships in which the Mohawk valley is situated, and as these extreme eastern townships are located in the Galapagos river valley, and are, therefore, tributary to Linn county, the proposition is that Lane restore them to their former and rightful owner. We are told that Lane will offer no objection to this arrangement so long as the Mohawk valley townships are left as they are. —Brownsville Times.
