BY THE EDITOR—WITH PENCIL AND SHEARS Current Topics of General Interest

A new series of postage stamps will soon appear, namely: the Buffalo Exposition series. The one cent stamp of green color, will have a picture of a lake steamer to represent the great transportation industry of inland seas in which Buffalo is so much interested. The two cent stamp, printed in red, will have a railway train; the four cent stamp, in red and brown, an automobile; the five cent, in blue, a picture of the new bridge at Niagara Falls; the eight cent, blue, a picture of the lock at St. Ste. Marie, and the ten cent, or light brown, an ocean steamer.

In the century just begun there will be 5,217 Sundays. In that which we have heartily yet learned to speak of as the last, Easter Sunday has occurred once on its earliest possible date, March 22, 1915, but this will not recur till the twenty-third century. The earliest Easter in the new century will be March 23, 1915. Easter Sunday will fall once on its latest day, April 25, 1915. This also occurred once in the century just passed—in 1866. Ascension day is practically always in May but on three occasions in the past century it occurred in June, in this century it will occur four times.

Albany papers are making quite an effort to get the people of the county sufficiently interested in their bridge to induce the county court to take it off their hands. The matter is not new to the majority of the people of the county, but we have our serious doubts as to the willingness of the county court to assume the burden of this bridge. The city has been authorized—at their request—to put a toll on the bridge, and in this way they hope to be able to secure revenues sufficient to keep it in repair, and eventually pay the interest on the indebtedness incurred by its construction. The bridge is a big load for the city of Albany, but the burden must be borne by someone, and it is of much more direct benefit to the people of Albany than any other bridge in the county.

The people of Oregon are to have the pleasure of seeing the president of these United States some time next month. This is a pleasure that has only been recorded the people of this great state, and in fact the entire coast but once before, and all are pleased to be honored by a visit from the nation's highest official. The visit of the president to this coast, is, however, made for political reasons, pure and simple, and were it otherwise or for the purpose of learning more of the needs or wishes of the people of the coast, the visit would be one of longer duration and more interest. As it is the president simply rides over the principal lines of railroad in a special car, attended by a number of politicians and negro waiters, and has no opportunity or desire to see this country, or to ascertain the needs or wishes of its people. President Harrison visited the Pacific coast on just such an errand several years ago, and the results of the coming visit of President McKinley will be identical with those of the former visit.

Planning a Rhododendron Excursion.

The beautiful weather we are now having is productive of spring fever, and our people, watching the swelling buds, many of which have burst into blossoms and leaves, are asking when the most beautiful of Oregon's wild flowers, the rhododendron, will bloom again. To get this information we are obliged to call at the Corvallis & Eastern railroad office. Rhododendrons attain perfect at Newport and Ave Creek between the 10th and 20th of May, depending on the weather. Usually the C. & E. run a Sunday excursion which inaugurates the seaside season at the coast. Mr. Stone, manager of the C. & E. informs us that one day excursion to the Bay will be generally discontinued this year, but that on Saturday, May 11, or a week later, May 18th, owing to the advancement of the flowers, the company will make a low rate, good for Saturday, Sunday and Monday. This will give passengers all of Sunday on the beach or gathering all they can carry of nature's most beautiful flowers, which nowhere flourish as at Yachina bay.—Albany Herald.
