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EDITORIAL HASH

The breeders of blooded stock of all kinds are increasing rapidly in the Northwest—more rapidly than ever before. This is a good sign. It shows an improvement of conditions generally. With the disappearance of scrub stock on the farm will disappear scrub methods of farming.

Postmasters throughout the United States have received orders from the department to discontinue the paying of money orders drawn on any other office than their own. For some time past, as an experiment, postmasters have been paying money orders drawn on any office, when they could satisfy themselves that the orders were all right. This scheme has been found unsatisfactory, resulting in much work and confusion, and some loss, hence the department decided to discontinue it.

At the fair meeting in Salem on Saturday last, Governor Geer told Mr. Smith that the farmers in the Waldo hills of Marion county, Oregon, had experienced difficulty in getting clover to grow. That some of them had given it up as impossible to make a success of it. Mr. Smith said they could make it grow if they would inoculate the land with soil where clover has grown—from Howell Prairie, for instance. It will need only a very thin coating of the clover soil to fit it for the growing of the clover plant.

The officials who intimated to the employees at the state institutions that the practice of entertaining friends at the expense of the state for long periods of time under the guise of visitors, when these people should be self-supporting and many of them are engaged in profitless employment with private parties, is a move in the right direction. The practice has been constantly growing, but there is no reason why the people should support anybody just because he happens to have a friend who is employed at one of the state institutions.
