Scio High School

PROSPECTUS.

During the year 1900, the Scio school trustees made announcement
that the school would open with a curriculum of work in harmony with
the high school work of the state, and conforming closely to the recom-
mendations of the National Educational Association, as to the make up of
such work.

The results, so far, will appear to have justified the action then taken
by the board and we feel that a foundation has been laid that will com-
mend itself to the citizens of Scio and vicinity. Since our circular of one
year ago, the State board has adopted a high school course and the work
in the Scio high school will be, in a measure, under the direction of the
State board of education.

High sounding declarations, elegant school houses, large expenditures
of money etc., do not, without results, indicate merit. The results during
the past year were all or more than the board could expect, considering
conditions and circumstances.

Since the close of the school year 1900, county diplomas have been
issued to fifteen graduates of the eight grade, certificates to seven
graduates of the business course, and two passed the county examination
for teachers' certificates.

The new law in regard to examinations requires students from univer-
sities, colleges, high schools and academies to go before the state and
county boards to pass an examination for certificates. This gives equal
opportunity to all and a person can fit for teachers' papers in our school to
good advantage.

The Goodyear-Marshall system of business training, which is exten-
sively used in colleges and high schools, was adopted by the board.
