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EDITORIAL HASH

The governor of New Jersey has received a warning from an anarchist society which says: "We are looking for your kind." It may occur to those red rag fellows a little later on, that the governors of every other state, and the officers of the government in general, are also looking for their kind.

Besides the three Presidential assassinations which resulted fatally another, to which no allusion seems to have been made of late, was attempted on the person of President Andrew Jackson on January 30, 1835 by one Richard Lawrence, says the Chronicle. The latter attempted to shoot the president as he was leaving the rotunda of the Capitol after attending the funeral of a Congressman. Lawrence snatched two pistols at Jackson, but both missed fire, although the percussion caps exploded. This would be assassin was found to be insane and consigned to an asylum.

The world does not require that you become a great lawyer, a great physician, or a great merchant; but it does require that you so carry yourself through life, as to uplift and not blight your fellow men; so as to help and not hinder, so as to elevate and not degrade them. It does ask that you shall not gain riches by impoverishing those who helped you to become wealthy, that your dollars shall be clean and not smirched with the guilt of trying to get ahead of your competitor by sharp practice; it demands that your wealth shall not be stained with the blood of widows and orphans, that you shall not lift yourself up by tearing others down.

Many people believe that the \$30,000 a year that the president gets as a salary is the sum total. This is a mistake. \$30,000 is given him in addition to his salary to pay his subordinates and clerks. His private secretary is paid \$3,250; his assistant private secretary \$2,150; his stenographer \$1,800; five messengers and two doorkeepers \$1200 each; steward \$1,800, and various other attaches who receive good salaries. In addition there is also paid him \$8,000 for incidental expenses such as stationery, carpets etc., and \$40,000 for repairs, furniture, fuel, green house, gas etc. In fact from first to last the president receives nearer \$150,000 a year.

There is slowly dying in a Baker City hospital a young woman who only five years ago was the beautiful and accomplished daughter of a prominent army officer stationed at Vancouver. She ran away with the wild son of a judge of the federal supreme court. He had no means, knew not how to work and became a gambler and piano player in a house of ill fame and the wife an inmate. Now he has deserted her and she is dying in a hospital. It is only another of the sad tragedies of life, but it ought to make every mother who hears of it feel the necessity of giving her boys and girls careful training for the duties and responsibilities of life.

Anarchy should be crushed out in this country and with no gentle force. Anarchists should not be permitted to land upon our shores, and those already here should be deported, destroyed or condemned to perpetual imprisonment. There is no room in a civilized—in fact in any organized government—for

vermin whose tenets and teachings would lead to the subversion or destruction of all government. If there is no law for the suppression completely and absolutely of all teachers and preachers of anarchy the lawmaking power of the country should not stand upon the order of the enactment of stringent laws that will make the further propagation of the doctrine of anarchy an utter impossibility. The first set of Congress should be one aimed at these dastardly enemies of society and of government, and then it should be enforced without mercy against men and women who advocate murder and destruction.
