Death of a Pioneer.  
William Winston Richardson died at his home in this city Sunday morning about 5 o'clock, aged 79 years, two days and 21 days. He was born in Green county, Illinois, July 12, 1822. He was first married in Illinois September 7, 1843, to Miss Edna Jane Young, and to them 11 children were born, 6 boys and 5 girls, seven of whom survive him. In 1851 they crossed the plains to Oregon, and settled on a donation-land claim five miles southeast of Scio, and resided there until 1893, when he moved to Scio, where he has since resided. His first wife died in April, 1892, and he was again married in February, 1894, to Mrs. Mary E. Coy, who survives him. He united with the Christian church in Illinois in 1842, during a meeting conducted by Elder John B. Curl, and has ever since lived a true Christian life. He was the last one of the original charter members of the church of that denomination in this city. He was known as a good neighbor, a kind and faithful father, husband and brother, and was ever ready to assist in time of need and affliction.

The funeral was held at the Christian church in this city Monday afternoon, the services being conducted by Rev. Roberts, of Aumsville, and the remains were laid to rest in the Masonic cemetery, followed by a host of sorrowing relatives and friends.

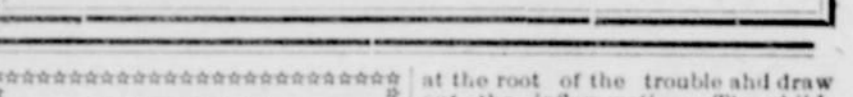
