## Land Money For Oregon.

Secretary of State Dunbar has disbursed to the various counties of the state the sum of \$15,113.55, that amount being the 5 per cent fund distributed by the state from the Government in the sale of public lands with in the state for the year ending June 30, 1901. The money is disbursed to the counties in proportion to their respective acreage. The apportionment per acre this year was \$0.0024-75/8. Of the entire amount Multnomah county, with one-fourth the population of the state, receives the fest sum, only \$69.90, since it has an area of only 281,220 acres. Linn county, having 1,451,620 acres, receives \$359.88.

## Hole in the Ground.

A cave that promises to rival the subterranean passages of the famous Mammoth Cave of Kentucky, has been discovered in Malheur county, 15 miles from Vale. The cave has been explored for half a mile but no end to the passage has been found. At the surface there is only a small opening, about large enough for a man to crawl into comfortably, but when in ten or twelve feet one enters a large room 30 or 40 square, and from this room several eaves enter the mountain in different directions. Plans are on foot to make a systematic exploration of the cave.
