Eighteen and a half cents a pound was the price paid for a seventy-five bale lot of hops of the 1922 crop in Salem on Tuesday. It is said to be the highest price paid here for hops in ten years. Offers to contract for the growing crop at 14 cents a pound are now being freely made. The outlook for Oregon hop growers the coming year is very bright. It

would be still brighter for the grower if they had had of their product contracted for in advance. Evidently the dealers will clean up a lot of money this year.—Statesman.

The total number of electors voting at the June election was 92,958. The vote on the proposed initiative and referendum constitutional amendment was yes, 62,224; no, 30,734. It carried by 15,561 over the necessary majority of 45,631. It would be interesting to know how many of the 23,228 who did not vote on the question were against the proposition.

The traveling baggage agent has been making a tour of this vicinity of late, offering inferior baggage and locks to the farmers at low prices. Arches For Pilgrims.

It is estimated that somewhere near 100,000 Knights of Pythias and their friends are going to witness the pilgrimage west to San Francisco in August next. For this event all the overland railroads have made especially low rates. The Californians are offering every hospitality. A feature of the reception will be big arches that will span the chief streets of San Francisco. They are to be models of architectural genius. The material is to be entirely of California production and composed of the choicest and finest woods and minerals in the state. The main arch will be seventy feet in width and fifty-eight feet in height. The exterior is to resemble ivory, trimmed with 34,000 feet of garlands for each arch, 100 wreaths of light, 7000 incenseburners, 200 arched flags, 100 double banners, 200 colonades, flags, pennants and emblems.
