Fare from Detroit to Mill City inclusive \$2.50; west of Mill City to Kingston inclusive \$2.00; west of Kingston to Maxwell inclusive \$1.75; Albany, Corvallis and Philomath \$1.50; west of Philomath to Chitwood inclusive \$1.00; all points west of Chitwood \$1.75.
This will be the former excursion of the year, and the time spent will repay ten-fold the cost of the trip.
