Back east the big strike has resulted in the death of several men, killed by strikers who wished to prevent their working in their places. This is a feature observed by nearly all people with displeasure. No matter how much justice there may be in the claims of those striking they have no right to take the law in their own hands, which they do when they raise their hands against a fellow man who endeavors to work. It is to be hoped that some day the golden mean between capital and labor is found and that in a spirit of compromise all differences shall be settled in a peaceable manner for the good of mankind.

Already have the members of the coming legislative session begun the preparation of pet measures which will be introduced at the earliest possible moment when the legislature convenes, and from the early start caused and the number outlined at present writing, we are lead to the conclusion that a flood of bills will be the result. Among the more meritorious measures proposed we note the following: Flat salaries for the state officers; creating the office of state mining inspector, and repeal of the coyote scap, bounty law.

Baker county has abolished the scap bounty. It is alleged by some that the destruction of the coyote means that the country will be over run by jackrabbits. The coyote is the deadly foe of the jackrabbit, and in places where the coyote has been killed off extensively the ravages of the rabbit is even more destructive than coyotes. The state bounty fund is now exhausted, and the counties will have to put up all the money for the coyote scaps or cease paying for them altogether, hence the action of Baker county.

September 9 is to be wedding day at the Portland Elks' Carnival. On that date not fewer than three couples will be united in a unique manner in the throngs in the street fair grounds. The donations of presents will equip them all complete for housekeeping, as the management of the fair will deal liberally with those who will consent to be married publicly at the expense of the Carnival company.
