PURELY PERSONAL

A \$300,000 Corporation.

Edward O'Neill, Frank O'Neill and Charles Callahan have been articles of incorporation in the County Clerk's office, the incorporation to be known as O'Neill Bros. & Callahan Company.

The articles of incorporation state that the purpose of the company "is to build, own and operate paper pulp, sulphite and all other kinds of chemical pulp mills; to construct, buy, lease and operate canals, water power, electric light and power plants; to own and deal in timber lands and real estate; to manufacture and deal in all kinds of paper, boards and products, and all other kinds of commodities which in any way now, or may hereafter enter into the business of said corporation; to borrow money, make and execute, execute and sign promissory notes and bonds for the purpose of raising money thereby to enable said corporation to carry on its business, and to make, execute and sign mortgages on any of its property.

The office and principal place of business of the company will be in Albany. The capital stock is placed at \$300,000 which is divided into 300 shares of \$1000 each.

The corporation at present operating mills at Lebanon, and will soon have a mill in operation at Niagara, on the North Santiam.—Herald.
