

SANITARY REGULATIONS.

Board of Health, Scio, Oregon. April 25, 1903.

Board of Health.

SEC. 1—There is hereby established a Board of Health in the City of Scio, said Board of Health shall consist of three members, Health Officer, who shall be elected by the Common Council and who shall be a practicing physician residing in the City of Scio, whose term of office shall expire when his successor has been duly elected and qualified and his term of office shall be one year. The Mayor and City Marshal shall constitute the other members of the Board of Health. And same Board shall perform their duties without compensation.

SEC. 2—The Board of Health shall have general supervision of the interest of the health and life of the Citizens of Scio, and make sanitary investigations and inquiries respecting the cause and prevention of disease and epidemics and shall have power to cause the removal of any and all nuisances or other causes affecting and detrimental to the public health. Said Board shall make and is hereby authorized and empowered to enforce such quarantine regulations as seems best for the preservation of public health and it shall be the duty of the city marshal or any member of said board to enforce such regulations subject to the authority of the city Health Officer.

SEC. 3—The Board shall meet as often as the proper and efficient discharge of their duties require.

Report of Infectious Diseases.

SEC. 4—It shall be the duty of every practicing physician or head of family within the city of Scio to notify the health officer in writing upon proper blanks furnished for such purpose, of the existence of any case of Small pox, Scarlet Fever, Diphtheria, Measles, Mumps, Chicken pox, Typhoid Fever, or any other contagious, or infectious disease, coming to their knowledge, and should any physician, or head of family, or any other person, refuse or neglect to comply with the requirements of this section, he shall be fined by the city recorder, not less than five dollars, or more than a hundred dollars, for each and every offense.

Report of Births and Deaths.

SEC. 5—It shall be the duty of every Physician, Midwife, Nurse, or head of family, under whose charge any birth occurs to report the same to the City Health Officer within 48 hours. Every physician, midwife, nurse, or head of family under whose charge a death occurs must report the same to the City Health Officer in writing giving name, date of birth, and death, cause of same and any other information which said Board may require, within 48 hours.

Permit for Burial.

SEC. 6—Any undertaker, head of family, or other person shall not bury, cremate or cause to be cremated or buried the body of any person, infant, or child until the death certificate is properly filled out and filed with the City Health Officer. Any person violating this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and be fined not less than ten or more than one hundred dollars.

Duty of the Health Officer.

SEC. 7—It shall be the duty of the City Health Officer to keep a record of all requirements of this ordinance, pertaining to the board of health, and report the same to the State Board of Health as by law required.

Notification of Infectious Diseases.

SEC. 8—That it shall be and is hereby made the duty every owner or occupant of every store, building, house, tenement, or hotel building in said city to give notice in writing to the health officer when ever any person shall become infected with any contagious or infectious disease within said building, within ten hours after ascertaining same, and should any person neglect refuse or fail to comply with the requirement of this section, he or she shall be fined for each and every offense, be fined by the city not less than five or more than one hundred dollars.

SEC. 9—That it shall be and is hereby made the duty of the owner or occupant of any house, store, building, or tenement in the City of Scio when ever any person has or may hereafter have the Small pox, or any other infectious or contagious disease, to give notice to the public at once of the existence of such disease in such house, store, building, or tenement by placing in some conspicuous place on the premises a yellow flag in case of Small pox, a red flag in case of Scarlet fever, a white flag for Diphtheria, a blue flag for Measles, and a green flag for any other contagious or infectious disease, and in case the owner or occupant of such house, store, building, or tenement, shall fail to neglect or refuse to place such flag, as aforesaid it is hereby made the duty of the city marshal as soon as informed of the existence of such disease, to place such flag as required and the same shall remain, there until the person having such disease shall have so far recovered that no danger of infection shall remain. And any person having failed, neglected or refused to place such flag as herein required, or having taken down or destroyed such flag when so placed before removal of all danger of infection, shall upon conviction thereof, before the City Recorder, be fined not less than five or more than one hundred dollars.

Exposure of Infected Persons.

SEC. 10—No person having any contagious or infectious disease shall go out in public or pass from house to house or building to building or appear in any street, alley, or other public place, in the City of Scio until he or she shall have so far recovered from such disease as to preclude all danger of infection and if the city marshal see or be informed of any person violating this section it shall be his duty to cause such person to be taken forthwith to his or her place of residence if within the city and if such residence is not within the city then to such place as the Board of Health may direct. Any person violating the provision of this section shall be fined by the city recorder not less than five or more than one hundred dollars.

SEC. 11—No physician or other person attending or visiting any person or

persons who may be sick with Small pox, or any other dangerous, infectious or contagious disease shall appear in any street alley or any other public place with out first having changed his or her clothes and used all reasonable precaution to prevent the spread of any such danger, contagious or infectious disease. Any person violating the provisions of this section shall upon conviction thereof be fined by the city recorder not less than five or more than one hundred dollars.

SEC. 12—The occupant of any house, store, building, or tenement, in the City of Scio when ever any person may have been sick with any dangerous infectious or contagious disease shall on the death or recovery of such person from such disease forth with destroy by burning the cloths used and worn by such person during such sickness and shall clean and disinfect the room and house under the direction of the Board of Health, where such person was confined. Any person who shall neglect or refuse to comply with the provisions of this section shall be fined not less than five or more than one hundred dollars.

SEC. 13—It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to enter the corporate limits of the City of Scio at any time who are in the opinion of the Board of Health, infected with Small pox or any other contagious or infectious disease or who may have been exposed to any such diseases within thirty days prior to such entrance. Any person violating the provisions of this section shall be liable to arrest from the City of Scio and on conviction before the recorder, be fined not less than five or more than one hundred dollars.

SEC. 14—It shall be the duty of the City Marshal deputy Marshal or any health officer of the City of Scio to enforce the provisions of Section 13 of this ordinance.

Nuisances.

SEC. 15—Any unclean privy, cesspool, water closet, hog pen, or any stagnant water upon any lot or premises within the city limits of the City of Scio is hereby declared a nuisance. No privy, pit cesspool, reservoir, hog pen, water closet sink shall hereafter be constructed or permitted to remain within 20 feet of the mill race or banks of Thomas creek, or within 40 feet of any well or water supply used for drinking or culinary purposes. And all privies, cesspools, reservoirs, hog pens, water closets or sinks now in use or constructed within 20 feet of said mill race or banks of the Thomas creek in the City of Scio is hereby declared a nuisance, and shall not be used after the passage of this ordinance, but shall be removed by the owner, occupant or agent thereof WITHIN TEN DAYS after the passage of this ordinance. All privy pits and water closets and other sewerage shall be at least six feet deep in the ground and so constructed, that the contents thereof shall not be exposed to the open air and public view, all privy vaults and water closets shall be disinfected on the 1st day of May, and August each year by using half a pound of Chloride of Lime in each of said vaults, when ever any privy vault, water closet or sewerage filled within one foot of the top of the ground it shall be filled with soil and thereafter not used. Any person or persons neglecting or refusing to comply with the provisions of this section shall upon conviction be fined by the city recorder ten dollars for each day that said nuisance is allowed to remain after due notice in writing by the Board of Health, if after five days notice by said Board of Health the nuisance still remains, it shall be the duty of the City Marshal to remove the same and the cost thereof shall become a lien upon the property and shall be collected in the same manner as other liens are collected.

SEC. 16—It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to keep more than two hogs confined in any pen, yard or lot of less dimensions than 500 square feet within the corporate limits of the City of Scio during the months of May, June, July, August and September. It shall also be unlawful for any person or persons to keep any hog or hogs in lot, pen or yard in the corporate limits of the City of Scio at any time unless said enclosure be kept clean and free from any stench, that may become offensive to any resident of the City of Scio and any person or persons found guilty of violating any of the provisions of this section shall on conviction thereof before the city recorder be fined not less than \$5 or more than \$50.

SEC. 17—All refuse matter or other rubbish in or around any store building, private residence, stable, hotel or barn, or any alley or street or upon any premises within the corporate limits of the City of Scio is hereby declared a public nuisance and shall be removed by the occupants, agents or owners of such or adjoining such alleys or streets, buildings, barns, or stables, by the first day of May 1903 and October first 1903 and each and every year thereafter, and as often as may be required by the Board of Health of the City of Scio. Any owner or occupant neglecting or refusing to comply with this section after due notice in writing by the Board of Health after five days the same shall be removed by the City Marshal, at the expense of said owner, agent or occupant, and such expense shall become a lien upon the property, and filed in the city docket and collected as other liens are collected.

SEC. 18—Any of the following shall be deemed a nuisance under the provisions of this ordinance: unclean privy vaults, unclean water closets, unclean hog pens, unclean cess pools, drainage above ground, stagnant water, rotten wood, lumber and stumps in the streets and alleys, ashes, leathers, dead animals and fruits, manure, thistles, and any and all other material of any character whatever unfit for use.

SEC. 19—It is hereby authorized that fifty copies of this ordinance or as many as may be necessary from time to time, be printed on card board and posted in public places in the City of Scio, and such necessary blanks printed as may be required by the Board of Health.

Penalties.

SEC. 20—The City Recorder of the City of Scio, may impose a fine of not less than five or more than one hundred dollars, or imprisonment, or both at his discretion upon any person or persons found guilty of violating any section of this ordinance.

SEC. 21—All Ordinances, or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

SEC. 22—This Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval by the mayor.
