INTERESTING NEW INVENTIONS

Stopper for Receptacles.

In the majority of the large cities stringent laws have been enacted in relation to the storage of inflammable liquids, the many accidents due to carelessness in handling this an absolute necessity.

In a great many factories and stores, where oils of all kinds are used in great quantities, proper care is not always exercised, and the receptacles in which they are kept generally are left with the spout open or, perhaps, an old cork, which should have been discarded long before, serves as a stopper. Besides being uncleanly, it is through such carelessness that fires start. A New Orleans man has patented a very good stopper that can be attached to either metallic or wooden receptacles used for the storage of oils and other fluids, the use of which will overcome both of the objections stated above. It is tapered to a point at its lower end, with a flange of rubber or other yielding material fastened on the outside, so that when it is inserted in the spout it will fit as tight as possible and prevent evaporation of the contents of the receptacle. The stopper is pivoted on the end of a rod, this rod being attached to a bar fastened to the receptacle, as shown in the illustration. A spring made of wire is wound around the bar, one end being attached to a small handle designed to pull open the stopper, while the other end is secured to the top of the receptacle, this spring keeping the stopper in place in case the receptacle is tilted or upset. Projecting from the lower end of the stopper is a guide rod, which extends into the spout, but is only partially withdrawn when the stopper is pulled out. This guide rod insures the stopper being seated in the spout, the weight of the stopper, augmented by the action of the spring causing the whole to fall into place after the spout has been opened and the quantity of liquid poured out.

Adjustable Bracket for Mirrors.

One mirror is seldom deemed enough by the average woman for arranging her dress and also for combing the hair, and that is where the little hand mirror is convenient and useful. Its one drawback is the fact that, as it takes the hand to hold it, it allows only the use of the other to work with. In the illustration is shown a simple adjustable attachment for a

small mirror, in conjunction with the larger one on the bureau, enabling the former to be adjusted to any desired position and also to compactly fold it out of the way when not in use. The upright supporting arm, made of tubular metal, is fastened to the edge of the bureau dresser, and is provided with a clamping screw for securing it in its adjusted position. All the arms are hinged together to permit them to swing horizontally, while the outer arm is provided with resilient jaws to hold the mirror. By the use of this contrivance the small mirror can be secured in various positions and the user can stand between it and the mirror of the bureau or dresser, dispensing with a hand glass and leaving both hands free for dressing or other purposes.
