LET JUSTICE PREVAIL.
What ever the result of the trial of Senator Mitchell now in progress in Portland may be, it is eminently satisfactory to the people that the indictment against the senator was not quashed, as his attorneys made a strong attempt to have done. What the people desire, is to have the charges against Senator Mitchell thoroughly investigated. If he is innocent of the charges alleged, we want to know it. If guilty, we desire that he shall pay the penalty. The senator has served the state a long time at Washington and he has accomplished much that has been beneficial for the state and the people; yet if he has become dishonest enough to violate his oath of office, after his long and useful career, it is due to the people that his guilt or innocence shall be fully established. This can be done only by a full and complete investigation before a jury, as is now being done. Had the indictment against the senator been quashed, as his attorneys made strong effort to have done, he would have lost a trustee before the people that he never could have regained. We could not know whether he was innocent as he claims, or guilty as he is charged. Indeed, if the senator is innocent of all wrong doing as he asserts so strenuously, no certainly Judge DeHaven a vote of thanks for not allowing the cloud to hang over him during the rest of his life.

But the effort to set aside the indictment is not an evidence of innocence. On the contrary, it is just the move that a guilty man would make. This is the view that all unprejudiced minds will hold and nothing but evidence of innocence will dislodge it.
The management on the part of the government, however, is honorable for placing the preparation of the indictment in the hands of Attorney Pugin, because of his great redundancy of words, the allegations in the complaint were so obscure that but for the fine discerning mind of Judge DeHaven, the prosecution would have collapsed. Judge DeHaven is a stranger to Oregon courts, but he has very quickly established himself in the estimation of the people as an honest, capable judge, who will not allow the defeat of justice by a mere quibble in the preparation of an indictment. The covert repugnant that he administered to Attorney Pugin was justly merited. Had the judge's sympathies leaned towards the deft he would probably have found just grounds for dismissing the prosecution. But the judge, evidently, thought investigation and justice demanded that Senator Mitchell should be placed on trial for the crimes charged.
In the future, when the government requires the preparation of indictment papers, especially in matters pertaining to Oregon, we would respectfully suggest that Oregon attorneys be employed, instead of importing a lawyer across the continent who thinks it necessary in drawing indictment papers to deliver a stump speech.

There are thousands of lawyers who would not make the mistake that Mr. Pugin made. They can be found in every important city in the land. The government made a narrow escape from having the expensive work of months go for naught, by sending an attorney here that was afflicted with a diaphanous words to prepare its indictments.
It is not going to do anything towards attracting some of the people who will visit our state during the summer, to our town and community? In many respects we have the most favored portion of the Willamette valley, in our vicinity. THE LAWN OF BETTER DAYS.
Without any doubts about the matter, the American people are determined to have a cleaner, more honest and all-around better conduct of public affairs in the future than we have been having in the past. They are aroused as they never were before, from ocean to ocean and from the great lakes in the north to the gulf in the south. They have concluded that prosperity and happiness for the great mass of the American people is of greater moment than the success of any one political party, and that a political party in its declarations of methods and principles promotes the welfare and prosperity of the common people and gives assurance that it will carry out that purpose, they will have none of it. Men of the character of Governor La Follette of Wisconsin, Attorney General of New York City, Mayor of Philadelphia and the late Senator Beveridge are becoming more and more prominent in the front prominently. It is a habit with courts to stand on the rights of the people when the rights of the people clash with plutocratic greed. There has never been a time since the close of the civil war when plutocracy and monopolistic greed was in as bad odor before the people as at the present time. There never has been a time in the history of the United States when the American House of Lords (the U. S. senate) was valued so lightly as at the present time. Now, there is just reason why all these conditions exist. The average American citizen will submit to much that is unjust before he will arouse from the inactivity of a private citizen and assert the right to what is justly his due; but when the pressure becomes too great, he hesitates not to assert his rights and, if necessary, to act. Evidently the American people have decided that the time has fully arrived to act.

Reform necessarily moves slowly, but always forward; never backward. The crying need of reform of the many abuses that were growing up in our political life gave birth to the People's party. With this party occupying prominence in nearly every state in the Union, education along reform lines became more rapid. In a short time these reform ideas were given place to the declarations of the two leading political parties, through which some of them have been enacted into law and others are in a fair way to reach the same result.
But the greatest of all reforms is the breaking down of rig rule and bossism in our leading cities. Many bootlickers and dishonest contractors are now being stripped because of the revolt of the people against cities against corruption, graft, bribery, etc., and the end is not yet. Perhaps the example of President Roosevelt in his attempts to renovate and purify governmental affairs has become infectious, and our leading cities have become inoculated with the virus. Whatever the cause, there is a disposition among the people everywhere to drive out dishonest and grafting officials from places of power and supplant them with men of whose honesty and integrity there is no question. If, in order to do so, it becomes necessary to dethrone the party in power, the people will not hesitate to do so.
Party fealty has become much more lax than formerly. It is no longer regarded as an unpardonable sin, from a party standpoint, to support an opposing candidate for office if he is the better man. Independence in voting has become the rule instead of the exception which thanks are due the American system of voting.
A number of officials that now occupy positions of power, whose sole aim is to acquire law honestly and punish wherever it may be found or it may effect, is a source of honor to all lovers of honest government. The example of an official to set law honestly and at least quibble, who believes that law says what means and means what it says, has become infectious and is being taken up after city and state after a state. We every reason to hope that this honesty and integrity in public and corruption that has been with the masses of the people, will sweep over the entire reform to no political party, for it is in the mind of the people and by the people. Through the secret ballot the people have literally become a terror to the political evil-doer. He knows not what to do or what to expect. From all indications, though, he can make up his mind to retire to the shades of ob-

VACCINATING THE GROUND.
That the soil can be vaccinated to cure it from the disease of sterility, is a fact that attends the vaccination of the human body to cure certain ills, would appear prophetic to the casual mind, but this is exactly what is done, according to an intensely interesting article entitled "Inoculating the Ground," by Gilbert H. Grosvenor, in the October number of the Century Magazine. In the most simple language he describes how, by a process of inoculation, the nitrogen, so necessary to fruitful land, is put back into the soil which is robbed of it by wheat and many of the other grain crops and rendered unproductive by reason of the robbery.
Even a skippy reading Mr. Grosvenor's article must be impressed by its importance to the land. The government at the end of the story we witness of vast tracts of now barren fruit lands in the eastern part of this country reclaimed and fruitful. Probably the most pressing thing about the whole matter is that the nitrogen germs so necessary to the soil's productivity are furnished free, by the Agricultural Department, the letters patent having been presented to the government by Professor Dr. George T. Moore, in charge of the laboratory of plant physiology of the department, who discovered how to practically utilize nitrogen germs.
But Mr. Moore was not the discoverer of the germs. It has been known for many years that the air we breathe contains all of the nitrogen necessary to the soil, and it was known that certain plants, like the clovers, bean and pea, did not impoverish the soil as some of the grains did. It remained for Professor Nobbe, a German scientist, to discover, as Mr. Grosvenor declares, that the bean especially takes its nitrogen from the air and that it stores more than it needs, and an ally enriches the soil with the surplus supply.
Then he found that all of these plants had bulbs, or round tubercles, or nodules, attached to the roots, as if an insect had bitten them. He dissected one of these bulbs and found it filled with bacteria that worked incessantly, absorbing nitrogen from the air to feed the plant.
Then the professor successfully cultivated these bacteria, and a German company was actually formed to supply them to farmers in bottled form. They did not live because they had been too well fed by the professor, says Mr. Grosvenor, and hence were not working for themselves. In the soil they died. The company stopped manufacturing.
Professor Moore cultivated a self-reliant disposition in his nitrogen bacteria. He did not overfeed them, and they began to seek their nitrogen food
