Prospects Are Not Bright.

Washington, March 6.—A conference regarding the statehood bill, now pending in the Senate, was held at the White House this afternoon. The parties to it being, besides the president, Senators Long of Kansas, Burkett of Nebraska and Warren of Wyoming, all supporters of the measure. It is conceded that the prospects for the enactment of the measure into law are not bright, and the conference was held for the purpose of considering means to save the bill.

Decides for Railroads.

Washington, Feb. 28.—The suits known as the citrus fruit cases, in which all the railroads of Southern California were interested, were today decided favorably to the railroads by the Supreme court of the United States, the opinion being by Justice Peckham. The cases involved the right of the railroad companies to designate the route for fruit shipped East after leaving the circuit court for the Southern district of California and also the order of the commission were reversed.

Five Year Census of Agriculture.

Washington, March 1.—Secretary Wilson, of the department of Agriculture, appeared before the House committee on census today in support of the Franchise bill for the compilation of farm statistics by the government every five years, instead of every ten years. Secretary Tomlinson, of the Stockgrowers' association, also urged favorable action on the bill.
