## PEOPLE WILL WIN IN THE END.

The American civil war, as an epoch in our National history can rightfully be pointed to as the most important period in our National development more than one respect. While the central feature of our great National drama was the demonstration of the vital fact that the United States was a Nation in accordance with the most complete definition of the term instead of being a sort of partnership of little nations, called States and from which partnership one or more of the partners could draw at pleasure, a new and most vital feature was born, viz.: that of specially-privileged classes.

Taking advantage of the Nation's extreme necessities, plutocracy forced Congress to concessions that made it possible to create fortunes so colossal and so quickly that the World, even today, stands astonished. In order to preserve the autonomy of the Nation, the value of property estimated at thousands of millions of dollars was by the simple stroke of the pen destroyed forever. The shackles of bondage of nine millions of African slaves were struck off, while at the same time Congress was enacting laws that made possible the enslaving of the entire producing classes of the Nation.

The very few inept laws that plutocracy was able to force Congress to enact at that time have been added to at session after session during the more than forty years that have elapsed since the great struggle. So gradual and so stealthy have been the encroachments of plutocracy that it has been most difficult to arouse the American people to the fact that they were being bound hand and foot to a slavery that would be productive of oppression and misery far in excess of what the black man suffered.

Some of the far-seeing statesmen of the Civil War days could see what would be the future results to the American people from the legislation that was then being enacted. The Congressional Record of those days will show the notes of warning there sounded. But despite the warnings the legislation was enacted which, with subsequent legislation along the same lines, has brought our Nation to its present condition.

While it is true that our Nation has increased in population more than a half-hundred millions and our National wealth has been multiplied many times, the conditions of the wealth-producers have not kept pace with the increase of population and wealth. Class legislation and special privileges have built such colossal fortunes for plutocracy, who have enjoyed these privileges so long, that they now look upon them as vested rights that should not nor could be taken from them. Their fabulous fortunes have led to the natural result—arrogance, disregard for law, and a general domineering, aristocratic feeling.

These conditions have finally culminated in a revolt of the people against plutocratic methods and the beneficiaries of special privileges. It has taken a long time to counteract the influence of plutocracy in the minds of public men, and in the deliberations of Congress, legislatures and the courts.

It is unpleasant to look upon the assassination of President McKinley as a public blessing. Not that he was an oppressor or an enemy to the interests of the masses of the people, but because his death placed Theodore Roosevelt at the head of the Nation. Since Mr. Roosevelt's installation as chief magistrate there has been a gradual return of the government to the interests of the people. While it is true that plutocracy still has a strong influence with the Senate, that influence is waning and that of the people is growing. So with the close of the first session of the 56th Congress it can be said that the people have the President, a preponderating influence with the House of Representatives, and an equal influence with plutocracy in the Senate.

What has already been accomplished in the restoration of the Government to the interests of the people. The trusts have been forced to acknowledge a master, the railroads have been compelled to submit to Government supervision and some headway has been made in the prosecution of the land thieves. However, the principal feature in the way of reform that has been accomplished is to cause plutocracy, the trusts, the railroads and the land grabbers to respect the authority of the courts. For forty years since the close of our great Civil War has the Government been conducted in the interests of plutocracy. With the habitation of President Roosevelt into the presidential chair, the doctrine of a "square deal" for all—the laboring man as well as the plutocrat—has been inaugurated. True, not very great progress in that direction has been accomplished, yet the

start has been made. The return of the government to the interests of the whole people is destined to be much more rapid than it was to place it in the interests of plutocracy. When men like Roosevelt, Folk, LaFollette, and many others, are so rapidly being brought to the fore and the great force of public opinion for the right is behind them—when it becomes popular for men to do right and to punish rogues, whether they be rich or poor—then the day of deliverance from the clutches of plutocracy cannot be far distant.

So there is much to encourage the people in the pursuit of reform and honesty and justice in the administration of public affairs. And the people will keep the ball rolling, too. They are beginning to see just how dangerously near the precipice of disaster the Nation had drifted. They have become educated to the fact that every voter has a duty to perform and that he can safely delegate that duty to no other person. He must perform it himself and the perpetuity and welfare of the Nation depend upon how well he does this duty.

This returning of the Government to the interests of the people is due solely to the influence of the independent voter in politics. So long as people were held firmly bound by the ties of party fealty reform was impossible. But when a considerable portion of the people refuse to support bad men for office and have political independence enough to vote for the other fellow reform has then begun. Reformation is never accomplished by a party standing pat. It is necessary to do things and do them differently than has been customary with the old party. It must rebel against political leaders whose principal aim is self-aggrandizement rather than the welfare of the people. When a public man, such as President Roosevelt is showing himself to be, is elected to office the people must and will hold up his hands. The fight against plutocracy, the trusts, the beneficiaries of special privilege, land grabbers, bondholders, and public plunderers, will probably be a long and bitter one, but in the end the people will win because their cause is just and right.

## WE MUST START THE BALL ROLLING.

Nearly all of our sister towns and cities are improving and progressing. Scio is practically standing still this Summer. Barring Dr. Prill's new office building there has been practically no improvement in Scio this year. Railroad development is the talk all over the State, yet our citizens are making no effort to have Scio included in the improvement. Now, while railroads are not liable to be built in the non-paying districts, Scio should not be included among the non-paying places. To say nothing of the ordinary freight traffic in farm products, stock and merchandise, which is not inconsiderable, our lumber facilities are unlimited. Even with the mills we now have, all of which are small, 1000 cars of lumber could be supplied annually. As before stated, our lumber facilities are unlimited. Thousands of acres of the finest of virgin timber awaits the lumberman's ax. Fine locations for large mills are abundant, which could easily load one or more trains daily. These facts we should make known to the railroad people. If we wait for them to search us out, every other portion of the country will surpass us in development.

Undoubtedly within the next ten years the Willamette Valley will be covered with a network of electric railways. If Scio will simply get a move on she can have one of the first lines that reaches out South from Salem. A line from Salem through Stayton, Scio, and on to Lebanon would have a paying patronage from the start. But if we remain dormant—if we do not make the fact known that Scio is on the map and that she is situated in the finest of agricultural and stock-raising sections we are liable, in the future as in the past, to be passed by. Our immense forests of timber; our banks of the best mineral paint on earth; the best section of the State for flax and hemp production; our splendid dairy region, all await development. To do this capital is required and in order to attract the necessary capital we must make our natural advantages known.

To this end some sort of organized effort on the part of our citizens is necessary. Development will not hunt us up. We must meet her more than half way. Opportunity awaits us if we will only take advantage of it and push and keep pushing our advantages. "There is a tide in the affairs of men that leads on to fortune." Let us make it easy for this tide to reach Scio. Let us clean up, paint up, remove untidily rubbish from public places and make our town as pleasant and inviting as possible. Scio's development depends upon the enterprise and business activity of our own citizens.

Many newspapers are exercising themselves over the possibility of William J. Bryan's possible candidacy for the presidency. These newspapers certainly view Mr. Bryan as a dangerous foe to the Republican party. They do not deny that what the country would be reasonably safe under Mr. Bryan's administration and that the reforms now in progress would be carried forward. They believe that Mr. Bryan would also institute reforms not yet begun, and here is the rub. They think, and rightly too, that one of his first stunts would be reform in our tariff laws. This is just what these people who are enjoying special privileges under our present tariff laws do not want. These aforesaid newspapers voice the sentiments of the specially privileged classes, consequently are endeavoring by holding Mr. Bryan up in the worst possible light to injure him in the estimation of the public that his chances will be nil. Their efforts are destined to be in vain. Mr. Bryan or some other man who represents reform principles, will be our next president. The tariff will be revised. The trusts and specially privileged classes will be required to relinquish any unfair or unjust advantage they now possess. President Roosevelt's doctrine of a "square deal" for all the people is bound to be the ruling principle in the future. As reforms never go backward this conclusion is inevitable and these people may as well pigheadedly try to submit they must. If from spiteheadiness they make the conditions more severe, they have but themselves to blame.
