

POULTRY PICKINGS.

A fowl already infested with vermin put a piece of blue ointment the size of a pea under in each wing and in the fluff of each bird.

Don't throw away a thing until you have given the hens a chance at it. Change the feed frequently, for there is nothing like it to set the hens laying.
