TAMMANY.

The Boss system in politics had illustrations of its beauties in the action of Tammany, Tuesday. The treachery characteristic of the aborigine from which the organization draws its name was never better exemplified. By every bosslet in the organization the atletto was plunged deeply into the back of the candidate for whom but a day or two before Boss Murphy had mouthed encouragement and allegiance. The war whoop of Powhattan was honorable in contrast with the lying professions of this treacherous New York boss. The original Indian led the settler into ambuscade in defense of a domain that was literally the Indian's own. Murphy and his political cut-throats led on their ambuscade for the best of New York city. They refused to support the candidate for whom they professed allegiance because he couldn't be handled. They wanted a tool to be Murphy's man, and a tool who from the nation's White House could promote the speculation and piracy practiced by Tammany hall. With this Tammany chief and his chieflets political principle is the hold-up of a city, and a political pledge the betrayer's kiss. To them this country is not a patriotic citizen's country, but a place to be prized only for the amount of loot it can be worked for. To such, citizenship is only valuable as a disguise for public pillage in the name of the state.

Knowing they could not make the Commoner Boss Murphy's man, the big and little bosses of the organization traded him on election day for votes for another they expected to make serve. They lied openly of their purposes and secretly worked the letting for the limit of that kind of loot. Their exploit is the climax of organized betrayal and ought to ostracize them for all time from party council. It ought for all time to be made the shibboleth of defeat for any candidate that tears the Tammany earmark. It ought to be made a war of extermination until creatures of the mold of Boss Murphy and systems with the civic conceptions of Tammany hall should become impossible.—Oregon Journal.

Where our Vegetables Originate.

In 1585 the potato was introduced into Europe by the Spaniards, who found it in Chile. At almost the same date it was introduced into England by the English, who had found it cultivated by the Indians of North America. The sweet potato and the artichoke are also American vegetables. Subsidy is found growing wild over Greece, Italy and Algeria. Turnips and radishes came originally from Central Europe. Cabbage, which is of remote origin, is believed to be a European vegetable. Asparagus found its origin in temperate Western Asia. Eggplant came to us from India. The carrot grows wild throughout Europe, Asia Minor, Siberia, China, Abyssinia, North Africa and the Canary Islands. The tomato comes from Peru, the cucumber from India and the pumpkin from Guinea.
