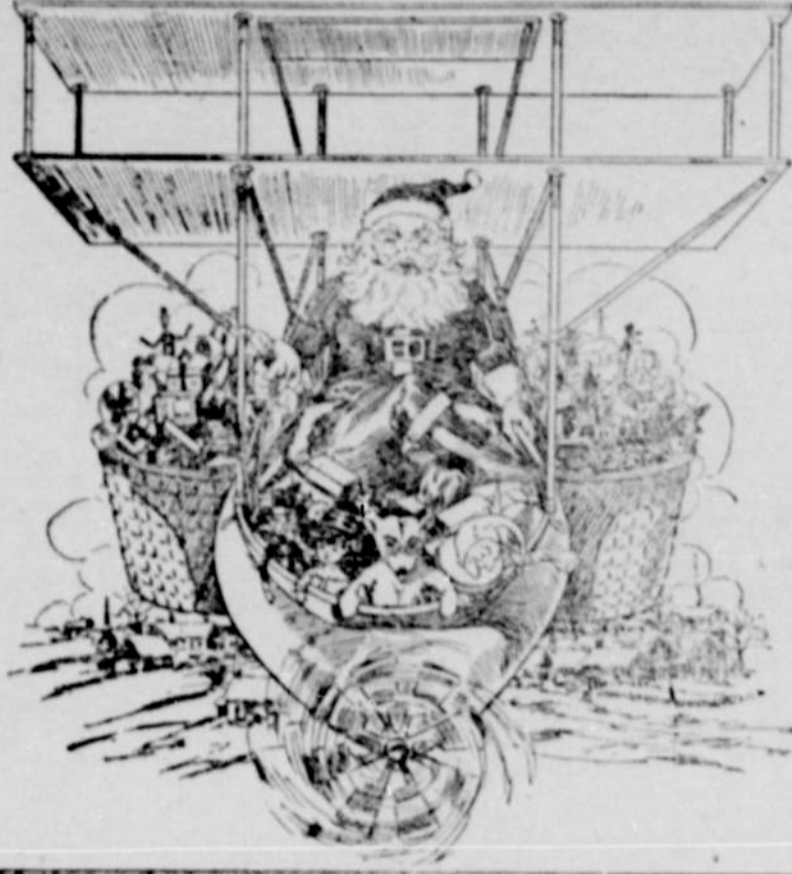

His age as given in the burial permit was 49 years, 8 months and 17 days. He was married to Ida Richmond on January 2, 1881. To this union was born four children all of whom together with a second wife survive him.
A short funeral service was held at the family home, after which the burial occurred at Franklin Butte cemetery on Wednesday December 16.
