E. L. Collins went to the Gold Creek mines, Saturday, with a pack train load of potatoes. He will bring out a ton of ore from Gold Creek for shipment.

Black Eagle reports good progress

in installing their machine drills. They are installing a 30-horse power gasoline engine with a 4-drill compressor. They now have a first-class saw mill with which they saw their own lumber for necessary buildings and timbers for other mining purposes.

The Silver King Mining Co., is developing its lead-silver property in the Elkhorn country.

Robert Monroe came in from Quartzville, last week, with some rich samples of ore taken from his property on Dry Gulch. One nugget weighed out \$60 gold. He, also, had considerable wire gold taken from the same shoot.

A great deal of development work is going on in the Ogle mountain district. Douglas Thome is opening up a group of 10 claims. Some ore recently brought out show native gold. This property is situated 7 miles northeast of Elkhorn.

The Crown mine has opened up an ore shoot of copper-lead ore on the Hazel No. 2.

Late work on the Wanderer claim shows some of the best quartz yet found. Assays for gold show a value per ton of \$29.35. Manager Feery will ship out several hundred pounds of ore for trial treatment, as soon as pack horses can be secured.

MALIGNANT SMALLPOX

Four Members of One Family Are Dead and Others May Die

The NEWS is privately informed that there is a most malignant disease prevailing in the neighborhood of Switzerland, a station on the Woodburn-Springfield branch of the S. P. a few miles south of Silverton. It is stated that the disease was brought by a family from the East who lately arrived there on a visit with relatives. Some four or five who were victims of the disease have died and it is probable that other members of the family will die as well. The malady is swift in its result, not lasting but two or three days.

The doctors down there first pronounced the malady "virulent smallpox" but the swift fatalities and the general symptoms do not harmonize with what has heretofore been known of smallpox. Dr. Cole, of this city, thinks the symptoms are dangerously what the medical books say are the symptoms of the Bubonic Plague.

The NEWS does not wish to be considered an alarmist; but it is proper that the people should know about this terribly swift and fatal disease, in order that they may guard against it in every way possible.

Later reports go to show that the malady is "malignant smallpox." The disease was brought from Mexico. Four fatalities have resulted so far. Rigid quarantine precautions are being enforced for all exposed families.
