**SCIO STANDS
AT THE TOP**

Supt. Jackson's Report Shows the Percentage of Growth of Our Schools

We give below a synopsis of Supt. Jackson's annual report. It will be seen that the percentage of increase for the Scio schools stand equal to the best and had the full enrollment (153) been made, Scio's percentage of increase would have been nearly 31 per cent. Scio stands fourth in the high schools of the county.

County School Superintendent W. L. Jackson has completed the school enumeration for Linn county and the figures are very gratifying, there being a healthy increase in nearly all districts. The total number enrolled in Linn county schools for 1911 is 7704, which is 285 more than appeared on the rolls in 1910, when the figures were 7419. Albany has 1473 school children this year, a gain of 91 or 6 per cent over 1910, when the figures were 1382.

In Lebanon the gain was 56, or 10 per cent, the enrollment in 1911 being 638 and in 1910 552. North Brownsville has gained 6, in 1910 having 265 and 1911 171; South Brownsville lost 2 having 209 in 1910 and at present 206. Harrisburg shows a healthy increase of 20 per cent, the figures being 1910, 175 and 1911, 210; Halsey has a decrease of 11, the enrollment in 1910 being 149 and 1911, 138. Scio gained 33 pupils, or 30 per cent, the 1910 figures being 117 and 1911, 150. On the fifteen high schools of Linn county having courses of from one to four years, the attendance is 618. In the 10 principal high schools of the county the enrollment for 1911 is as follows: Albany 255; Lebanon 89; N. Brownsville, 28; Scio, 33; Halsey, 27; Harrisburg, 31; Oakville, 19; and Lacombe, 19. Superintendent Jackson reports 12 or 15 new school buildings erected in Linn county during 1910, all modern and substantial structures, the best being those of Albany, Brownsville and Lebanon. A card containing many useful suggestions is being mailed by Mr. Jackson to the teachers throughout the county and will undoubtedly be of great benefit to them in conducting their rooms properly.
