Beckwith, Mr. Hartog, State Senator M. A. Miller, Editor Hofer, State Representative W. E. Miller and extended an invitation to anyone in the audience to make remarks.

The members of the courts thought that the cost of the bridge would be between \$40,000 and \$60,000. Their talks implied that as there had been no levy for this special purpose made, the work could not be undertaken, this year. But after hearing the sentiment of the audience as expressed by a number of speakers, it was quite evident that the courts had modified their opinions.

Petitions from Stayton, Aumsville, Turner and Salem, were ready to file with the Marion county court and petitions having about 500 signatures has been filed with the Linn county court. A committee consisting of E. C. Peery, John Holt and W. E. Miller has been appointed to push the matter before the Linn county court and a like committee has been selected to wait upon the Marion county court for like purpose. It is proposed to push this matter and keep pushing until the order is made to build the bridge. Certainly, there is no place in either county where the demand of traffic is more deserving of a bridge and The News believes that with a proper presentation of the matter by these committees, the courts will make the order.

Lebanon is to have a 3-story concrete hotel. The building will have 50 rooms, will be steam heated and modern in every respect.
