BACON HOGS ARE PROFITABLE

Swine Grower Gives Result of His
Experience in This Line—
Variety of Feeds Used.

A swine grower who has turned his attention to growing and feeding bacon hogs has this to say of his experience and results with this kind of feeding:

For ten years I have been raising bacon hogs, and I find that there is money in them. I prefer to have my litters come about April 1, so that they can get on the grass with their mothers by May 1, or about that time, according to the weather. From the time they are able to eat I have a trough for them by themselves, feeding skimmed milk and bottled potatoes. I don't wean them until they are about eight weeks old.

After weaning they are kept on pasture, fed skim milk, potatoes and a little shorts and wheat bran, either scalded or soaked for 12 hours. I have fed rape for many years, but am going to give it up, as I consider peas and oats grown together, two parts peas and one part oats cut green and thrown into the pasture twice a day better food than rape. New clover makes the best pasture, as the hogs eat it off clean. This feeding is kept up till they are four months old. They are then fed crushed grain, such as the farmers of Prince Edward Island generally grow for feeding purposes—barley, oats, peas, mixed with boiled potatoes while hot, and made soft enough to run out the pail.

Hogs fed this way will dress 150 pounds to 190 pounds at eight months old. I believe that a farmer who keeps five or six milk cows, by pasturing his hogs in summer, feeding the skim milk and the unsalable potatoes and mangel can raise pork for four cents per pound. When using potatoes always boil them. If feeding mangels or turnips, pulping is best mixing with middlings or cracked grain.

I will give you the figures on two lots of pigs that I have raised. The first pen of ten pigs was farrowed August 1, and killed when six months old. When dressed they weighed 1,802 pounds, and were sold at 8¢ cents a pound for \$157.67. They were fed 45 bushels of grain at a cost of \$21.45; 145 bushels of potatoes, \$36.50; 40 pounds of skim milk a day, \$8.50; total cost of feed, \$66.45—a profit of \$91.22. The potatoes used were the small ones. Labor was not counted, as we considered that the manure paid for the work.

Lot No. 2 of nine hogs was farrowed October 2 and killed at four months and two days old. They weighed 990 pounds, sold at 8¢ cents a pound, for \$86.62. The feed consumed by these hogs was 12 bushels of mixed grain, weighing 40 pounds to the bushel at \$1.40 a hundredweight, \$6.72; 2,000 pounds of skim milk at 30 cents a hundredweight, \$4; 50 bushels of potatoes and turnips at 12 cents a bushel (the unsalable ones), \$6; nine pigs at \$2 each, \$18; total cost, \$34.72—a profit of \$51.90 on nine pigs.

KEEP EGGS IN WATER GLASS

Can Be Kept Fresh in Solution for
Eight to Twelve Months—Another
Excellent Formula.

Water glass can be obtained of most druggists and is a heavy, almost colorless liquid, costing from 10 to 30 cents a pound. Eggs will keep perfectly in this solution for eight to twelve months, says the Agriculturist. The other formula is to mix one pound fresh stone lime and one-half pound table salt with four quarts boiling water. After slacking and settling draw off the clear liquid and pour over the eggs so as to cover them. This is an old-fashioned method, but is very effective. Eggs kept in water glass may be taken out during fall and winter and sold for packed eggs at about five cents a dozen less than the price of fresh eggs. Many families can safely pack a few dozen to use for cooking purposes in winter, but whether it is a safe business venture to put down several hundred dozen is another question. The safest method, and the only one available on a large scale, is to use cold storage, where the eggs can be held at 28 to 30 degrees. A temperature below 27 degrees is required to freeze the egg and split the shell.

A Green-Food Rack.
A skillful device for furnishing green feed to poultry consists of a frame made several inches high and covered with netting. Oats, or any preferred crop may be sowed and the rack with netting placed over it when of suitable size and the fowls then turned loose. They seem to delight in walking about on the netting and snipping off the green blades within reach. Yet, they cannot get at the roots to scratch and the plants have a chance to renew their growth thus pruned off, and the fowls are continually adding fertilizing material. For poultry kept on close range as a means of furnishing food the plan is certainly commendable.
