Codlin Moth Spray—2 lbs. arsenate of lead to 50 gallons of water for Codlin moth, the pest that causes wormy fruit. Spray trees as soon as most of the blooms have fallen; watch for this time then get to work and do thorough work. For scab, add one gallon of the lime sulphur solution for each 25 gallons. Be sure and keep the mixture well agitated or the arsenate of lead will settle. Repeat spray in about 10 days. Black leaf 40 (tobacco extract) is best for the tiny black or green aphids (plant lice) that infect the tips of fruit trees, rose bushes, shrubs, etc. Use freely before the leaves begin to curl. Also, now is the time to begin getting your fruit for the Albany Apple Fair this fall.—D. W. Rumbaugh, Fruit Inspector.
