Train 14, carrying equipment present No. 16, will leave San Francisco at 10:20 p. m., arriving Portland 7:00 a. m. These trains will run via Woodland, carrying section observation car, Present No. 13 changed to No. 15, leaving Portland 1:30 a. m., arrive San Francisco 1:10 p. m. No. 16 leave San Francisco 8:20 p. m. arrive Portland 8:15 a. m., and will handle local business north of Eugene, these trains running via Sacramento. Trains 27 and 28 will be limited trains between Portland and Eugene. No. 27 will leave Portland at 5:15 p. m., arrive Eugene 9:05 p. m. Train 28 will leave Eugene 7:00 a. m., arrive Portland 11:15 a. m., making stops only at Oregon City, Woodburn, Salem, Albany and Junction City, making connection at Albany for Corvallis and Lebanon.
