Probably the briefest document
ever prepared as a will was a signed
and dated memorandum, "Every-
thing is Lou's," written by decedent
in a railway train record book kept
by him, his widow's name being
Lula. The instrument was held to
be sufficient as a holographic will,
however, in Smith versus Smith, 79
Southwestern Reporter, 491, by the
Virginia supreme court of appeals.
A note reading, "Dear Old Nance,

friend, E. A. Gordon," was sus-
tained as a will in Clark versus
Ransom, 50 California 395, and a
dated and signed memorandum,
