School Journals

The Free Traveling Library arrived some time ago and considerable interest has been shown in the books it contains. Tuesday evening of each week from 4:00 to 4:30, the librarian will be at the school building for the purpose of loaning the books. These books are for the public. Come and look them over. You will find some interesting and profitable reading.

Some additional periodicals have been ordered for the high school reading room. These with the ones already coming to the school, will very well supply the students with reading matter of this class. The ones now coming are the Literary Digest, Saturday Evening Post, and O. A. C. Barometer. The new ones are Current Literature, Normal Instructor, Oregon Teachers Monthly and the Technical World.

We would call the attention of parents to the amount of home study done by their children. Except in the lower grades and in unusual cases, home study is necessary to good results, for the lessons assigned cannot be properly prepared within school hours. Lessons in mathematics can well be prepared at home. Below is what is generally considered a fair amount of home study in the various grades:

1st grade, occasional half hour
2nd & 3rd grade, 1-2 hour daily
4th & 5th grades, 1 hour daily.
6th & 7th grades, 1 to 1 1-2 hr.
8th grade, 1 1-2 to 2 hours.

High school, 2 to 4 hours.

Parents whose children study more or less than is assigned above, might do well to consult the teachers and ascertain whether their children's preparation of lessons is really satisfactory or not.
