Andy DeVany passed through this vicinity Saturday.

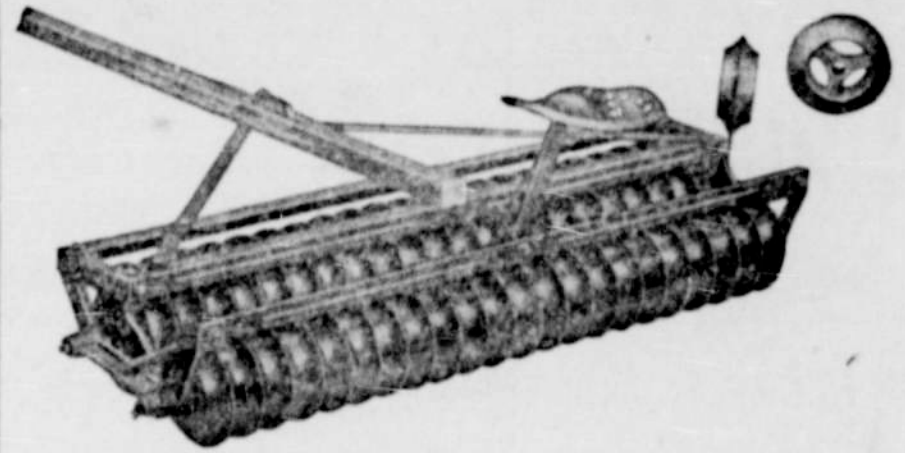
