**Mary A. Shelton**

Mary A. Shelton whose maiden name was Forney, was born in Henderson Co, Ill, Nov 9, 1845 and died at the home of her daughter Mrs Elva Phillips at West Scio, Aug 23, 1913, aged 67 years, 9 months and 14 days. She crossed the plains with her parents, brothers and sisters from Illinois in 1852 and settled with them on their donation claim at Jordan, moving from there to near Corvallis, where she was united in marriage to Lee Shelton on Nov 12, 1863. They lived on their farm east of Scio until recent years, moving from the farm to Scio, and in 1911 from there to West Scio. Her husband died July 23, 1912.  
 Ten children were born to this union, 3 girls and 7 boys, one son and one daughter having died many years ago. Those surviving her are, Frank, John, Art and Clifford Shelton and Elva Phillips of West Scio, Roe Shelton and Laura Knauf of Scio, and Albert Shelton of Arlington. Four sisters survive her, Meshames J T Phillips, Corvallis, and Nancy J McCoy, Priscilla Friend, and Mattie Sharp, respectively of Vancouver, Cle Elum and Collic City, Wash.  
 Mrs Shelton was a member of the Missionary Baptist Church at Providence, and continued a faithful member of this church until her death. She was a kind, loving mother, a good neighbor, loved and respected by all who knew her. Interment was made in the Miller cemetery between Scio and Shelburn Sunday evening, Aug 24. Services were conducted by G L Sutherland.
