The parcel post is a great institution—for most everyone except the printer. Last week we had occasion to send a few trespass notices by mail to a customer who lives about four miles from Scio. The package weighed one pound and Uncle Sam graciously consented to undertake its delivery for the modest sum of sixteen cents. Had our customer's farm been large enough to require twenty pounds of trespass notices, the postage would have been \$3.20. At the same time any other business man in Scio could have sent his wares to our customer by the same mail, whether it had been diamonds or cotton socks at the rate of five cents for one pound, or fifteen cents for twenty pounds. If any other common carrier in the United States were to discriminate in this manner, federal prosecution would follow very quickly.
