THE SPECIAL ELECTION

The referendum measures which are to come before the voters at the special election November 4 are: University of Oregon appropriation, Sterilization Act, County Attorney Act, and Workmen's Compensation Act.

The above measures should all be voted in the affirmative, not only because they are meritorious, but also from the fact that the voters of Oregon should put their unqualified stamp of disapproval upon the abuse of the referendum. These measures were all made laws by the state legislature last winter, and the few malcontents who are responsible for their being submitted to the voters at this special election, thus putting the state to heavy and needless expense, should receive a rebuke from the voters which they cannot fail to understand.

While all the bills are worthy, the University Appropriation is by far the most important to the state, as its defeat would work more harm to the commonwealth than can well be reckoned in dollars and cents. Such a deliberate blow aimed at our foremost educational institution would give Oregon undesirable notoriety all over the United States.

Give the soreheads a slap, and the state a boost, at the election November 4, by voting.
