Bonfire Originally "Bone-Fire."

It is doubtful, however, whether any bonfires contain even a proportion of the matter whereof bonfires were primarily constituted, to wit, bones; for originally "bonfire" was "bone-fire," signifying "a fire of bones," and the older method of spelling the word was common down to near the end of the eighteenth century.
