

Alfred M. Shelton

Alfred M. Shelton was born in Patrick county, Virginia in October, 1829, and died at St. Mary's hospital in Albany, May 29, 1914 at the age of 84 yrs 5 mos. He moved with his parents to Missouri and in 1847 they crossed the plains to Oregon and settled on a donation claim on Thomas creek about 7 miles east of Scio. He took up a donation claim on Thomas creek at Jordan about 12 miles east of Scio, where he resided almost continuously until 1910, when he moved to Lyons. He was married in 1854 to Sarah J. Turner, to which union 13 children were born, 8 girls and 5 boys, 7 children having died. Surviving him are his widow and six children, J. W. Shelton of Lyons, Harvey Shelton of Jordan, Emma Bilyeu of Crabtree, Ida Worthington of Oswego, Maud Burmester of North Bend and Stacy McCall of Albany. Two brothers and one sister living are James Shelton of Albany, Haman Shelton of Jordan and Sarah Gaines of St. Johns.

Mr. Shelton was a member of the Masonic lodge of Scio. His word or obligation to men was lived up to, and his honor and integrity were not questioned. He was always kind and accommodating to his neighbors, a substantial citizen and home builder, loved and respected by all who formed his acquaintance, a kind husband, father and neighbor. One more of our dear pioneer fathers has passed to his reward.

The remains were taken from Albany to Lyons May 21, when a short funeral service was held at his home, conducted by Rev. Wilson, a Baptist minister. Interment was made in the Fox Valley cemetery one mile east of Lyons, under the auspices of the Masonic Lodge of Scio. D. P. Mason of Albany delivered the impressive ceremony at the grave.

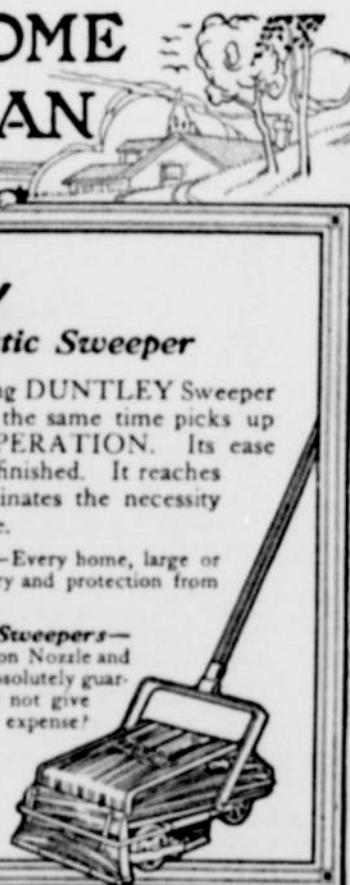
