## Chiropractic

The following excerpt from an editorial in a recent journal is of particular interest to the people of this state at this time, says the Oregon State Board of Health Bulletin:

Chiropractic is a freak offshoot from osteopathy. Its followers assert that disease is caused by pressure on the spinal nerves and can be eradicated by 'adjusting' the vertebrae. It is the sheerest kind of quackery, practiced largely by men whose general education is as limited as their knowledge of anatomy, and who are profoundly ignorant of the fundamental sciences on which the treatment of diseases in the human depends. Chiropractic is taught (heaven save the mark!) on the mail order plan. The modern medical school requires that its matriculants have a fairly good general education. The so-called 'colleges' of chiropractic matriculate anybody who can pay the fee. The medical school requires, in addition to a good preliminary educational foundation, four years—in some cases five—of hard study with much practical work before granting the degree of doctor of medicine. The chiropractic 'schools' profess to teach individuals how to treat disease by a few weeks' mail order instruction. Study the advertisements of any concern that professes to give a 'course' in chiropractic. Send for the advertising matter and obtain the follow-up letters by which these alleged schools obtain 'students.' The keynote of every piece of advertising matter that emanates from these sources is that there is 'big money' in chiropractic. Chiropractic is in no sense a profession. It is a scheme by which sharpers induce men, generally of little education and with a dwarfed moral obligation, to learn the tricks of a disreputable trade quackery.

Since the law licensing osteopathy has gone into effect, requiring a knowledge of anatomy and a definite degree of study, Oregon has been overrun by this branch of fakers. One flagrant case recently, a so-called 'doctor of chiropractic,' was fined \$75.00 in a local court, when in connection with his 'adjustments' given for a case of tubercular laryngitis, that has since died, he charged the man \$8.00 for a bottle of sulphur and water to apply to the outside of his neck.

One of the most pernicious and misleading of all advertisements is one going the rounds of this state at the present time, in the various moving picture houses. The film is entitled 'The Pale of Prejudice.' It shows a young physician with a most wonderfully equipped office, piled high with skeletons, chemicals, retorts, etc., etc., with all the essentials necessary not only for studying anatomy, but for making steel analyses. He is called suddenly to see a young woman who is ill, whereupon he rolls up his sleeves, pours half the contents of an 8-oz bottle down the young woman, who immediately dies. After this he becomes converted to chiropractic, loses his license to practice medicine from the State Board of Health, and his engagement to the Governor's daughter is broken off. When she is taken ill, the entire State Board in consultation inform the mother that her daughter has only one hour to live. The daughter sits up in bed, plucks a rose from the bosom of her kimono, which she gives to her mother who rushes to the office of the ex-physician who is now officing in a bare room and practicing chiropractic. Harrying with an enormous six shooter to the scene, he drives the Board away at the point of his gun, lifts the young woman from her bed makes three 'adjustments' of her spine; she recovers in twenty minutes and is married in 24 hours. The final scene shows this particular branch of quackery licensed by the Legislature, the bill signed by the Governor. On the back of the program where this film is showing is the name of every chiropractor in town. Surely P T Barnum knew whereof he spoke when he said, 'The people love

to be humbugged.' The ordinary highwayman or porch-climber, who rakes a few dollars away from his victim, is a gentleman compared to one who, taking advantage of the ill, robs them under the guise of healing.
