ance is the water specimen cup,  
which is let down on the sounding  
line and is so arranged that the re-  
sistance of the water keeps open the  
valves of the cup during its descent  
and closes them during its ascent.  
Water from any given depth can  
thus be brought to the surface for  
examination. These water cups are  
strongly built to resist the great  
pressure.—New York Tribune.
