### Music Has a Marked Effect Upon the Men Who Do the Fighting.

Every one has read that stirring poem, "The Relief of Lucknow," of the Scotch regiment that had been besieged and starved so long, that had staved off massacre for so many days that it had about lost hope, when a Scotch maid heard away off in the distance the faintest note of a bagpipe.

"Dinna ye hear it?" she screamed and threw herself down with her ear to the ground. Soon they all heard it, the bagpipes of the regiment coming to rescue them.

It was the pipes of the Highlanders! And now they played "Auld Lang Syne," it came to our men like the voice of God. And they shouted along the line.

### Important Notice

To the presidents and secretaries of all the Farmers Unions:

We have an urgent request asking you to lay before your locals, whose servants you are, to get together and begin now to assemble your orders for winter goods. We have an opportunity to buy direct from the manufacturers, boots, shoes, dry goods, blankets, macinaws, underwear, overalls, shirts, socks, ladies hose and underwear, at absolute wholesale prices. So begin now to make up your orders and be able to report to me by Sept 1 the needs of your locals. Appoint a special solicitor in your local to interview each member as to their needs for the coming winter. Be specific in making out sizes and numbers (most everyone knows the size of shoes, shirts, overalls, etc. they wear) and report them as much as possible in groups of a kind. For instance: 6 pair overalls, say 33x33, that means waist 33 in., length 33 in., and you would make out your order like this:

6 pr overalls 33x33 (specify bib or waist as to style)  
6 over shirts size 16 (neck measure)  
6 pr shoes, heavy, No. 9s  
6 pr white or gray wool blankets, specify color, weight and size, wt 5 lb size 60x80, 66x80, 72x84, 74x90  
As a usual thing men's socks should be about 2 sizes larger than the No. of shoe. If you wear a No. 9 shoe you would want No. 11 socks. Undershirts should be about 2 sizes larger than the waist measure of drawers—if you wear a 36 in. waist drawer you should get a 38 undershirt.  
The following list will be almost true to fit and size.

**Ladies' Under Suits**  
Size 3 fits figure of 115 lbs, size 4, 115 to 130; size 5, 130 to 150; size 6, 150 to 165; size 7, 165 to 180; size 8, 180 to 200 lbs.

**Misses Under Suits**  
Size 2 fits age 3; size 3, 4 to 5; size 4, 6 to 7; size 5, 7 to 8; size 6, 9 to 10; size 7, 11 to 12; size 8, fits 13, 14, 15.

**Boys Underwear**  
Size 2 fits age 3; size 3, 4 to 5; size 4, 6 to 8; size 5, 8 to 10; size 6, 10 to 12; size 7, 12 to 14; size 8 fits 14 to 16.

**Childrens Vests**  
Size 16 fits age 1; size 18, 1 1/2 to 2; size 20, 2 to 4; size 22, 4 to 6; size 24, 6 to 8; size 26, 8 to 10; size 28, 10 to 12; size 30, 12 to 13; size 32, 12 to 13; size 34 fits 13 to 14.

**Childrens Pantalets**  
Size 16 fits age 1 to 1 1/2; size 18, 1 1/2 to 2; size 20, 2 to 4; size 22, 4 to 6; size 24, 6 to 8; size 26, 8 to 10; size 28, 10 to 12; size 30, 12; size 32, 13; size 34 fits 14.

The above sizes are approximately correct for ages of children. Ladies are sized to bust measure and should wear same size pants as vests.

**Ladies Shoes and Hose**  
Size No. 2 shoe takes 8 hose, 2 1/2 and 3 shoe takes 8 1/2 hose; 3 1/2 and 4 shoe takes 9 hose; 4 1/2 shoe takes 9 1/2 hose; 6 and 7 shoe takes 10 hose.

**Misses Hose**  
Size 0 to 4 fits age 2 mos; size 1 to 4 1/2 fits 6 mos; size 2, 3, 5 fits 1 to 1 1/2 yrs; size 4, 5, 5 1/2 fits 2 to 2 1/2 yrs; size 6, 7 fits 3 to 4; size 8, 9, 9 1/2 fits 4 to 5; size 10, 11, 7 fits 6 to 7; size 12 to 7 fits 8; size 13 to 7 1/2 fits 9; size 1 to 7 1/2 fits 10; size 2 to 8 fits 11; size 3 to 8 1/2 fits 12 to 13 yrs.

**Gents Shoes and Hose**  
Size 5 to 5 1/2 shoe takes 9 1/2 hose; 6 to 7 shoe, 10 hose; 7 1/2 to 8 shoe, 10 1/2 hose; 9, 10 and 10 1/2 shoe takes 11 hose.

By following these tables, you will in most cases get your fit. You had better cut out and preserve this list for future use.
