# Frances C. Crabtree

She was a faithful Christian, a loving and self-sacrificing wife and mother and a most kindly helper of all when in need of a friend. In her last illness she was a most patient sufferer and her call to her heavenly home was a relief from the pain and suffering that characterized her illness.

She was laid to rest in the Franklin Butte cemetery. Rev. C A Rexroad of Corvallis conducted the funeral services at the home, the Rebekahs officiating at the grave.
