Victor Lyons and Inez Hirons have returned to school at Scio after a three

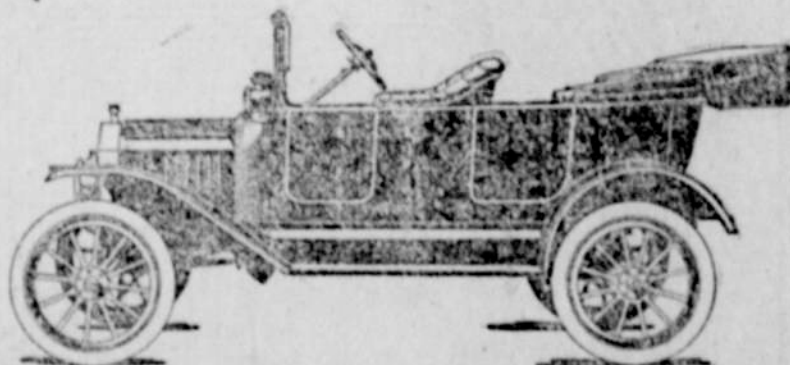
