District No. 1  
Main street, from steel bridge north to Smith street; Roadway 50 feet wide, Macadam 50 feet wide.  
Total length, 582 feet; total frontage, 1,164 feet; assessed to city, 196.5 feet; assessed to property, 967.5 feet.

Drainage..... .71

Macadam..... 1.53  
Total..... \$2.64

#### District No. 2

Main street, from Oak street north, to the south end of steel bridge; Roadway 30 feet, Macadam 30 feet.  
Total length, 341.1 feet; total frontage, 682.2; assessed to city, 63 feet; assessed to property, 622.2.

Drainage..... .22  
Macadam..... .91  
Total..... \$1.42

#### District No. 3

Main street, from Smith street north to North street; Roadway 40 feet wide, Macadam 16 feet wide.  
Total length, 770 feet; frontage, 1,540 feet; assessed to city, 333 feet; assessed to property, 1,207 feet.

#### District No. 4

North street, from west line of Main street, to west line of West street; Roadway 40 feet wide, Macadam 16 feet wide.  
Total length, 855 feet; total frontage, 1,716 feet; assessed to city, 176 feet; assessed to property, 1,540 feet.

Drainage..... .05  
Macadam..... .49  
Total..... \$ .67

#### District No. 5

Main street, from 6th street, north to north property line of Oak street; Roadway 30 feet wide, Macadam 16 feet wide.

Total length, 1,040 feet; total frontage, 2,080 feet; assessed to city, 360 feet; assessed to property, 1,720 feet.  
Cost per front foot:  
Excavating.....\$ .38  
Drainage..... .06  
Macadam..... .43  
Total..... \$ .87

The above figures are submitted by the city engineer on a basis of \$1.50 per cubic yard for crushed rock, and 50c for earth. Any reduction in the cost of these two items will materially reduce the expense of the improvement.
